Dear California Student Aid Commission,

This letter is a request for a deadline postponement to allow students to submit their 2021-22 FAFSA or CADAA applications after the March 2, 2021 deadline due to disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Extreme efforts have been made to contact and support students in gathering necessary paperwork and completing applications, however the barrier of not being on campus in person to complete these applications with a counselor or CSAC staff has proven very difficult and resulting in late or incomplete applications.

We have encouraged students to attend the virtual financial aid outreach events that were organized as a replacement for the in person events that were cancelled. The attendance was very poor, being that many of our students have connectivity issues and share devices among several family members.

Our data shows that there has been a reduction in the number of students who have completed their financial aid applications this year in comparison to last year.

Please accept this letter as Allan Hancock College's (AHC) request for the 2021-2022 Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and California Dream Act Application (CDAA) application deadline postponement. We will demonstrate utilizing completion data that students within the AHC District deserve to have their financial aid application extension approved due to the many restrictions in place regarding in-person services due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The data collected by the Central Coast Cal-SOAP reflects that 30 in-person Cash for College events were scheduled to take place from October 1, 2020 to March 2, 2021. However, in September 2020, we had to make an immediate shift in providing services from our traditional in-person due to COVID-19; one-on-one assistance model at each of our feeder high schools to an online-remote Zoom session by appointment model.

The data attached reflects there was a significant drop in attendance at the online-remote Zoom sessions. For example, a typical turn out for the first Cash for College events at Nipomo High School would have been between 60-80 seniors, however 25 appointments were scheduled and only 16 students attended the online sessions. Pioneer Valley High School, with the highest number of seniors, dropped from a typical turnout of 100-120 seniors per night to nine seniors. In order to counter the significant loss of participation, access to financial aid assistance was increased over winter break between December 14, 2020 and January 15, 2021. These additional efforts helped increase senior applications by 214 students. However, our overall numbers continued to be below our numbers from 2019.

Overall, Central Coast Cal-SOAP and AHC's Financial Aid department would normally assist between 1,200 -1,400 high school seniors with financial aid applications. For the 2020-2021 year, our numbers were reduced to 673 or half of the seniors typically served.

To Whom It May Concern,

The Alliance College Ready Public Schools respectfully requests a 2021-2022 FAFSA and CADA submission deadline postponement. We are submitting this request on behalf of our 18 high schools (see second page for High School names and CEEB Codes). The reasons (as required by CEC Section 69513.2.(e)) we are requesting this deadline extension are:

- 1. Virtual learning has led to a significant drop in financial aid completion for the class of 2021. This drop is very much attributable to the disruptions in supporting students due to the pandemic and the lockdown.
- Schools were forced to cancel their in-person financial aid workshops for students and families, instead attempting to individually support students via video chat meetings. While we did offer virtual workshops, attendance was significantly lower compared to in-person workshops from the year prior.
- 3. As of 3/2/2021, 64% of Alliance Seniors submitted an error free financial aid application. This represents a drop of 25% in the financial aid completion rate for the class of 2020 as of 3/2/2020.

The Coronavirus pandemic has continued to be an ongoing challenge in how we conduct outreach and provide support for application completion. Our college has been unable to conduct on-site events to assist students and families with the FAFSA and California Dream Act Application. We conducted several virtual financial aid application events with very low participation. Coordination with K-12, students and families have been a significant challenge along with limited access to technology for families, especially in rural counties like ours.

We generally support 25 Cash4College outreach events. We were only able to successfully coordinate three outreach events, Although we do offer appointments for application assistance many families of high school students are unaware how to access virtual services. We did send out communication to all high school counselors regarding the workshops and webinars sponsored by the commission however, those events were low attended by students in our area.

Financial aid applications across the state of California have seen a drastic decline (-30,000) from this time last year. Butte and Glenn counties are no exception. Based on the data available through the California Student Aid Commission's Race to Submit Dashboard, Butte county is seeing a 10% decrease in application submissions while Glenn county has decreased 18% from last year.

We encourage the Commission to continue to offer virtual application workshops through the summer. These virtual times require a statewide effort to pull all resources together in efforts to provide our communities with the most accessible support services.

The COVID-19 pandemic has had a severe adverse effect on on-time FAFSA filing for soon to be high school graduates, especially those in low income and minority serving high schools. California Baptist University is a Hispanic-Serving Institution with 36% of CBU's undergraduate population being Hispanic. There are many articles from reliable higher education sources citing that FAFSA applications are lagging for the 2021/2022 school year among high school seniors. We feel that allowing our students' FAFSA applications that are submitted by April 1st to qualify as meeting the traditional March 2nd Cal Grant deadline will have a huge impact on our new students' ability to afford college.

Employees from CBU's Financial Aid Office coordinate, run, and attend many financial aid workshops for high school seniors to promote on time FAFSA filing. Typically, these workshops are held during school time or immediately after school at local high schools where our Financial Aid Outreach Coordinator and other staff are able to assist high school counselors in answering any questions that come up as their students complete their FAFSA in person at the event. This practice has been impacted because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Since students are not at school in person it has become increasingly difficult to assist in the same one-on-one manner that our staff would have been able to in the past at these events. Many of these events have not been scheduled by the high schools to the extent they were in previous years. We even have a few examples where the responsible person from the school did not show up to open the online meeting.

We have 290 students potentially eligible for Cal Grant that submitted their first 21/22 FAFSA from 3/3/21 to date (3/18/21) and have projected that we will have an additional 69 applications completed between 3/19/21 and 4/1/21. We are unable to see if these students' GPA was submitted on time, but assuming it was, allowing these students' FAFSA applications to qualify as being turned in on time through April 1st has a potential impact of \$3,861,404 in the 2021/2022 school year alone. We ask that it is approved to allow all FAFSA applications received by April 1st to be considered on time and to meet the Cal Grant deadline.

Feedback from college personnel that oversee many of our equity-centered programs state a steep drop-off in student contact as the effects of the pandemic continue to disproportionately impact our highest need communities from which we draw many of our students. These programs have long relied upon evidence-based data to implement activities and follow-up services that engage and retain our students.

The inability to meet with students in-person for one-on-one and group activities including weekly financial aid application workshops has resulted in fewer of our students meeting critical deadlines including March 2, 2021 to submit their 2021-22 FAFSA or CADAA



applications. Our college's applications are down 18.4% over last year's as of the March  $2^{nd}$  annual deadline and down by almost 20% as a three-college district.

Please approve this letter of appeal due to the extraordinary circumstances that the COVID-19 pandemic has placed upon all of us. The 30-day postponement gives us time for additional and targeted outreach and may prove to be a lifeline to our most vulnerable student populations.

The Corona virus pandemic has continued to be an ongoing challenge in how we conduct outreach and provide support for application completion. Our college has been unable to conduct on-site events to assist students and families with the FAFSA and California Dream Act Application. We conducted several virtual financial aid application events with very low participation. Coordination with K-12, students and families have been a significant challenge along with limited access to technology for families.

There has been a significant decrease in outreach events requested by high schools over the last year due to COVID, from 118 to 64, 45% decrease in number of events. The number of participants was also down significantly, from 8298 to 1909, 76% decrease.

Financial aid applications across the state of California have seen a drastic decline (-30,000) from this time last year. Los Angeles and Orange counties are no exception. Based on the data available through the California Student Aid Commission's Race to Submit Dashboard, Los Angeles county is seeing a 7% decrease in application submissions while Orange county has decreased 6% from last year.

We encourage the Commission to continue to offer virtual application workshops through the summer. These virtual times require a statewide effort to pull all resources together in efforts to provide our communities with the most accessible support services.

Our students reside in East San Jose and the surrounding Downtown area, a region that has been adversely impacted by COVID-19 in comparison to the rest of Santa Clara County. While navigating college and financial aid applications and maintaining academic performance is a challenge any year, the pandemic made it more difficult. Seniors could not easily access resources due to extremely slow wifi. They are typically the eldest child in the household, so they took on more responsibilities, such as caring for younger siblings/family members, working part-time to make up for the loss of parental income, etc. The majority of our parents are not privileged to work from home, some lost employment and do not qualify for government assistance. Several families caught COVID and some had to mourn the passing of a family member.

Our first class of seniors graduated in 2018. Since Fall 2017, we host 2-3 in-person financial aid nights in October in partnership with Cash for College so parents are available to attend. The majority of students are able to submit, as they have access to multiple experienced financial aid advisors, high-speed, reliable internet, a printer for signature pages, and envelopes and stamps to mail signature pages. We did our absolute best to try to replicate this type of support virtually and remotely, but the pandemic has disproportionately impacted our low-income students of color. During the first week of October, we hosted 3 financial aid nultiple staff members available to pull students and their parents into breakout rooms to submit their applications in 15-minute appointments. Some students who did not attend or had extremely slow wifi and couldn't complete the application during the outreach events.

By January of 2020, 13 out of 99 students had not submitted their financial aid applications. By March 2, 2020, 1 student had not submitted their financial aid application due to a mental breakdown that needed to be prioritized. By January of 2021, 41 out of 109 students had not submitted their financial aid applications, which was unprecedented. By March 2, 2021, we thought 100% of students submitted their applications. Unfortunately, by mid-March, we discovered that some students did not submit or submitted for the wrong year. Our highest performing students who communicate well, have strong follow-through, and work hard have struggled to perform at the same level as they have in the past during the pandemic. If we were in person, our students would have submitted and submitted for the correct year. We serve our high school graduates until they complete college (315 students). With large caseloads, some students were not able to meet the Cal Grant Deadline, as well.

Cristo Rey San Jose Jesuit High School is a private high school in San Jose, CA, and serves high school students and graduated high school students from low-income households as determined by Santa Clara County's income guidelines. Students and their families primarily reside in East San Jose and the Downtown region. The Principal is the highest administrator at the school.

The Del Norte County Unified School District (District) and Del Norte County Office of Education (COE) are requesting a deadline postponement for the application for Free Application for Federal Student aid (FAFSA) and California Dream Act Application (CADAA), pursuant to CA Ed Code Section 69513.2.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the District and COE were unable to implement our usual program to ensure that every eligible student within the District and COE has had the opportunity to complete the FAFSA and/or CADAA. High school counselors were only able to meet with student in person on a limited basis until the re-opening of the high school on February 16, 2021. Many of our students are the first in their households to submit a FAFSA or CADAA, and many do not have the support of families with the knowledge to assist them adequately. Furthermore, due to the geography and remoteness of our community, many students also struggle with internet access when they are not in school.

In October, our "Cash for College" event with CalSOAP was changed from in-person to virtual, and as a result, we only had approximately 10% of the students who would normally participate actually in attendance. We also typically hold a series of family engagement and application completion events in October and early November to provide all families the opportunity to meet with school staff, get application assistance in their native language, and submit the application. All of these events require an in-person component, due the complexity of information and necessity of internet connectivity. We were unable to hold these events due to restrictions in place due to COVID-19.

Over the past few years, we have had increasingly large numbers of students completing applications early in the year. As of today, however, less than one half of the graduating seniors throughout the county have completed the appropriate applications. As was stated earlier, our

schools resumed in-person instruction on February 16. We are dedicated to ensuring that we reach out to all remaining seniors, to help them apply, and to support them in their postsecondary careers.

Once again, we respectfully request a deadline postponement to meet their needs.

East Los Angeles College is requesting an application deadline postponement for the 2021-22 FAFSA from March 2, 2021 to April 2, 2021. This postponement will allow students who submitted their FAFSA or Dream Act application between March 3, 2021 to April 2, 2021 to be considered as on time applicants for Cal Grant funding.

Due to the impact of COVID-19, it has been challenging for our students to complete their applications by the deadline. Many of our students come from low income families and do not have the technology they needed in a distance learning environment and therefore to complete the Cal Grant application with limited assistance. In the past, our Financial Aid Office would provide in-person assistance in the ELAC Financial Aid Computer Lab in order to help students with the application process. Due to the pandemic, this type of in-person assistance is not available. Additionally, we have found that many students are using their cell phones to attend classes, complete assignments and take tests online, as well as to complete their FAFSA/Dream Act Applications. The lack of technology and in-person assistance has hindered their ability to complete the FAFSA/Dream Act application in a timely fashion in order to meet the California Student Aid Commission application deadline for 2021-2022 of March 2, 2021. As a result, many of our students will lose their chance to receive Cal Grant funding for their educational needs.

Our campus Financial Aid Office has continued to promote financial aid awareness by conducting online classroom presentations and providing weekly FAFSA/Dream Act application workshops beyond the original March 2, 2021 deadline in the attempt to reach out to as many students as possible. However, we are only able to offer these services online which greatly impacts the number of students who are able to attend the presentations and workshops.



The Coronavirus pandemic has continued to be an ongoing challenge in how we conduct outreach and provide support for application completion. Our college has been unable to conduct on-site events to assist students and families with the FAFSA and California Dream Act Application. We conducted several virtual financial aid application events with very low participation. Coordination with K-12, students and families have been a significant challenge along with limited access to technology for families.

In the previous year 2019-20, ECC hosted at least forty (40) financial aid outreach events. In 2020-21 the financial aid outreach was able to host seventeen (17) separate virtual events which was down significantly due to the pandemic. We have a virtual financial aid help desk for application support but many high school students are unaware of how to access our virtual services. Our Outreach department sent communication to all high school counselors regarding the financial aid workshops and webinars however, those events also had low attendance compared to previous years.

Financial aid applications are down 13% at El Camino College for October 1, 2020 to March 2, 2021 compared to applications received from October 1, 2019 to March 2, 2020.

We encourage the Commission to continue to offer virtual application workshops through the summer. These virtual times require a statewide effort to pull all resources together in efforts to provide our communities with the most accessible support services.

The opportunity for senior students from the EI Monte Union High School District (EMUHSD) to submit either a FAFSA or CADAA financial aid application was greatly hindered by circumstances directly brought about by the COIVD-19 pandemic. Although EMUHSD has put forth extensive technical support to all EMUHSD students, technical issues and communication obstacles have hampered the rate at which our senior students typically submit their financial aid applications. EMUHSD students have been distance learning throughout the duration of the financial aid submission window. Students continue with distance learning at this time.

In collaboration with the Cal-SOAP Los Angeles Consortium, EMUHSD has provided six online Cash for College financial aid workshops for senior students district wide. Although successful, students did not attend these workshops at the same rate our students have traditionally attended when these workshops were in person. Individual school sites in our district have also conducted online financial aid workshops but they too were not attended at the same rate of traditional in person workshops either. On occasion, some of these site workshops were cut short or cancelled when technical issues arose.

According to the California Student Aid Commission's Race to Submit Website, 67% of EMUHSD seniors from the class of 2020, submitted a FAFSA or CADAA application. That number is 9% lower for the class of 2021, at 58% who have submitted a FAFSA or CADAA application.

#### 4. Additional comments (if any):

88% of EMUHSD students are socio-economically disadvantaged. Our students' living situation during the pandemic has often been compromised at a greater rate than more affluent communities. From challenging living conditions, to higher rates of COVID-19 infections, to increased financial hardships and on-going technical issues, our families and students have struggled in many ways including submitting their financial aid applications. I respectfully ask that the California Student Aid Commission consider a 30-day deadline postponement of FAFSA and CADDA applications for students from the El Monte Union High School District.

Re: Application Deadline Postponement Request

Elk Grove Unified School District requests a deadline postponement for (EGUSD) students to submit their 2021-2022 FAFSA or CADAA applications after the March 2, 2021 deadline.

A significant number of students were unable to submit their 2021-2022 FAFSA or CADAA application due to disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

EGUSD hoped to mitigate this impact with scaled-up communication to students and families regarding virtual workshop dates for completing financial aid applications. In addition, multiple distance learning platforms and the number of workshop dates were increased for reaching out to students and parents. District and school site staff provided workshop instructions remotely –with reinforcement of californiacolleges.edu as the central location to launch all applications.

Data comparing 2020 and 2021 FAFSA/CADAA completion rates indicates fewer students completing their FAFSA/CADA submission in 2021 compared to previous years. Additionally, we also see fewer students completing Cal Grant applications as of March 2nd.

- District-wide FAFSA/CADA workshops were held virtually on 10/6; 10/22; 10/28; 10/29; 11/4; 11/18; 12/3
- School-site FAFSA/CADA workshops were added and held virtually, Jan/Feb at various school sites.
- Attendance to these district and school site financial aid workshops was lower as compared to previous years;
- Students signed up for workshops however, only 50% -60% of registered students were in attendance to the actual online workshop events.
- Counseling staff and other educators were limited in provision of direct student services and guided assistance for students who traditionally struggle with academic technology, online learning, and launching of electronically submitted applications.
- EGUSD has a large number of English Learners and students eligible to complete the CADA (CA Dream Act) application.
- Counseling staff and Bilingual Translation Associates (BTAs) observed a diminished number of EL and other students participating in the online workshops as compared to previous years, in-person workshops.

We continue to monitor student progress and make adjustments as needed, and continue to do whatever is needed in order to insure our students' success. Based on the above, EGUSD is requesting an extension to the March 2nd deadline for students to submit and complete FAFSA/CADA applications.

Even when scheduling an appointment with a student/family, its not uncommon for the studet to simply not attend the zoom appointment and theres very little the advisor could do about it. As a result we have had much slower and lower submission rates by March 2nd. Its been a very inefficient year in that respect.

In past years we have fluctuated between 90% and 99% submission rates. Currently we stand at 71% submission rate.



Eureka City Schools would like to request a deadline postponement to allow Eureka Senior High School students to submit their 2021-22 FAFSA or CADAA applications after the March 2, 2021 deadline.

The educational platform of the 2020-2021 school year has been greatly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Due to the pandemic, our school district was on full-distance learning from March 2020- March 2, 2021. Distance learning has presented many challenges for our staff in FAFSA/CADAA outreach and completion. With students off-campus and in-person access not available, they have worked diligently to remotely reach students and families to support FAFSA/ CADAA completion. This is especially challenging due to the high poverty rate and Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACES) scores of our students.

To support FAFSA/CADAA completion, Eureka High School intended to offer two online Cash for College Workshops and had to cancel the second workshop due to no sign-ups. The North Coast CalSOAP also offered workshops for Eureka students and had no attendees. Counselors presented in distance-learning senior classes where they conducted FAFSA/CADAA completion workshops and offered individual application Google Meets to support application completion.

When comparing the 2020 to 2021 FAFSA/CADAA application submission rates as posted on the CSAC Dash Board you will see the submission rate is 66% to 61% respectively and the completed Cal Grant application rate is 62% to 56% respectively.

Due to the reduction in students who have completed a financial aid application from the previous year, I respectfully request that Eureka High School be granted the application deadline extension in order to increase application submissions.

The Gilroy Unified School District (GUSD) requests a deadline postponement for GUSD students to submit their 2021-2022 FAFSA or CADAA applications after the March 2, 2021 deadline.

-A large number of students were unable to submit their 2021-2022 FAFSA or CADAA application due to disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

There has been a large reduction in the number of students who have completed a financial aid application from the previous year. You can find the data comparing 2020 and 2021 FAFSA/CADAA completion by your district here: <a href="https://webutil.csac.ca.gov/dashboard/">https://webutil.csac.ca.gov/dashboard/</a>. In every case, the high schools we serve decreased in financial aid application completion rates. In the best case scenario the drop was almost 20% and others reached a low of as much as 50% fewer applications than were submitted in 2020.

-Remote learning has had an adverse effect on students' ability to submit their financial aid applications.

-Attendance at districts financial aid workshops has not been the same as they are in person or from previous years.

-State other reasons for the district's low FAFSA/CADAA completion rate. Ex. Large number of English learners, Dreamers (student who had a more difficult time logging into virtual workshops)

Although we have been offering limited, in-person education this school year, we still have at least a third of our students who chose to stay distance learning due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Our counselors have worked extremely hard to engage seniors in their financial aid process, but many are reporting a large disengaged population. Our counselors have limited access to students who are "in person ", as we are on a modified quarter system and students are only on campus one day a week for three hours. Also, many students are just now hearing about their UC and CSU decisions, so the "realness" of their next steps are finally sinking in and this additional time will allow students and families the opportunity to see if they are eligible.

We normally have two or three Cash for College events in our district every year and this year we were not able to offer any. Many of our sites usually work with our two local community collges to provide one on one support for families, and although we offered some virtually, the highly sensitive topic of finances is tough to do over a zoom. Our sign ups for these events were not what we hoped. With some of the "restrictions" being lifted this week in California, we may have more families who are more comfortable coming to campus in person for help.

For school year 18-19 to 19-20, our district saw a 9% growth in FAFSA/CADAA completions with 1,952 students submitting applications and 907 students qualifying for a Cal Grant. Challenges for our students include but are not limited to the following reasons: Limited access to in-class time with local high schools; Internet accessibility; technology challenges, etc. The Hartnell Community College District has continued its partnerships with the local high schools to provide workshops and presentations for FAFSA and CADAA completions. The college has also established a partnership with the United Way of Monterey County to provide further financial aid application assistance to the greater Monterey county area.

Due to the disruption to in person student services as a direct result of the COVID-19 pandemic, which is a declared National Emergency, students have had an adverse effect on their ability to submit the FAFSA and CADAA by the March 2 priority deadline. Outreach activities and our ability to attend area high schools as part of the usual FAFSA/CADAA application process have been significantly impacted since March 2020. Latinx families have been disproportionately affected by this change. The number of applications from our region has decreased for the 2021-2022 academic year.

We reduced from 35 in-person Cash for College Workshops in 2019-2020 to 15 Cash For College Workshops all in a virtual environment. Participation in the virtual workshops was significantly lower than in-person workshops, particularly with Latinx families. There was a significant delay in receiving communications from CSAC regarding Cash for College Workshop cycle. The first "Train the Trainer" workshops were offered in October 2020 (usually this begins in August).

Sonoma County high school students who have completed a FAFSA/CADAA by the March 2 deadline has seen a significant decrease. Nearly 52% of enrolled high school seniors completed a financial aid application in 2020, while only 43% of all enrolled high school seniors have completed the FAFSA/CADAA for 2021. The number of students receiving a Cal Grant award for 2021-22 is down by 23.6%. This is a clear indicator of the disproportionate impact the pandemic is having on our lowest income students who do not have the access to technology and resources.

The COVID 19 pandemic and school closures have resulted in a lack of access for our students to work with counselors and site staff to complete their FAFSA/CADAA applications. The inability to meet in person has led to confusion around the application itself. Many students have filled out the incorrect application due to confusion and the level of support that was able to be provided. Internet access has served as a barrier for our students and families. Internet speeds have led to students getting discouraged as the process has taken up to 3 hours for some of our students. Many students experienced errors and had to restart the application, which led to frustration and discouragement. Many families also do not have the proper equipment, including a printer and scanner, to complete the signature page. Being all online has not allowed for classroom presentations and workshops. In a typical environment, counselors and staff would have been able to pull small groups and individual students to offer additional support. During the 19-20 school year, our students did not have access to technology, so the regular engagement and lessons that we provide to Juniors were not as comprehensive. Outreach from our community colleges as well as support has also decreased.

Our FAFSA completion rate was 53.6% for the class of 2020, and is only 41.8% for the class of 2021. This is a significant decrease and we would like to extend the deadline in order to make a final push for FAFSA completion.

While we have strived to meet the needs of students in a virtual format, we have had less success than needed. As a community with a very high poverty rate, very high English learner rate and very low community education level, it is difficult to meet the college access needs of our students without being able to meet with them and their families in person.

Holy Names University is submiting a deadline postponement request due to Covid-19. The students at Holy Names University have had numerous challenges that affected their ability to submit a FAFSA or CADAA applications on the established deadline. Most of the outreach conducted this year has been virtual. Some of our current and prospective students have had challenges with network connections and accessing information resulting in a significant number of students unable to attend or miss the virtual information and tutorial sessions conducted. In addition to this, virtual learning has taken a toll on all students and has caused a lot of anxiety. Students have grown accustomed to large group workshops and face to face office visits where they can received one on one support. This has been very difficult due to COVID. In addition to our students facing challenges, the virtual environment that COVID forced all educational institutions into has brought challenges to all of our staff members. Contacting students and getting information to them in a timely manner has been a challenge in the new uncharted virtual world of COVID. We offered workshops Online, open virtual office hours and virtual office appointments to our students, however, the outcome has not been as successful in disseminating information to students compared to previous years.

Working with our local high schools has also been a challenge during this past year. New incoming freshmen are not accustomed to checking their emails daily and our inability to contact them has caused some prospective students to miss the deadline. HNU serves an extremely needy population and many of our incoming students usually have difficulties understanding the guidelines and regulations they are required to be met. Without proper personal guidance these prospective students face misunderstanding and confusion. The outcome of this lack of understanding has been a delay in submitting their application. It has also been brought to our attention that FAFSA and CADDA applications that have been submitted this year prior to the established deadline compared to last year's numbers has decreased. In light of these challenges faced by our students and staff during the Pandemic, we ask that the extension for our students get extended. Thank you for your consideration.

Every year, Kerman Unified, in collaboration with the Central Valley California Student Opportunity and Access Program (Cal-SOAP), works tirelessly to assist all our seniors with their post-secondary transition. One of the transition aspects includes the completion of their financial aid application. Serving a large population of underrepresented students along with many first-generation students, it is of utmost importance that we serve our due diligence in meeting their needs in supporting them in accessing post-secondary education. This year has been adversely affected by the COVID-19 school closures.

This year's workshops include virtual sessions which became a challenge because of faulty internet connection. Several of our students live in remote areas in which they do not have access to reliable internet. As a result, some students experience many technical difficulties in trying to log on to virtual workshops hosted on Zoom. Also, our high school sites, Kerman High School and Enterprise High School hosted various in-person sessions with very little success since many of those students that were unable to attend stated that it was due to the lack of transportation to our campus sites while others did not attend because of health risk concerns.

Over the last few years, we have seen a continually increasing trend in the number of FAFSA/CADAA application submissions. This year has been the exception. According to our March 2nd competition numbers, only a little over 67 percent of our students completed and submitted their FAFSA/CADAA by the priority deadline. That is about a 10 percent difference from the 2019-2020 school year. As a firm believer in equity and access for all students, I ask for your consideration to granting an additional 30 calendar days beyond the March 2nd, 2021 deadline for students who were unable to submit their 2021-22 FAFSA or CADAA application due to disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

In previous years, transportation would have not been an issue since Cal-SOAP has graciously offered on-campus application workshops during the school day but was unable to do so due to the school closures and the directive from their consortium to work with their school sites remotely because of COVID-19 protocols.

As superintendent of the Long Beach Unified School District, I write to request that the March 2, 2021 deadline for submission of 2021-22 FAFSA and CADAA applications please be extended by an additional 30 days per the Commission's Grant Special Alert 2021-09.

The ongoing global COVID-19 pandemic has caused tremendous hardship for our students, many of whom are among the demographic groups most impacted regionally and nationally. Our student body is 58 percent Hispanic, 12 percent African American and 62 percent socioeconomically disadvantaged. For an entire year, our students have been struggling to continue their education via distance learning, even as many families have been impacted directly by the coronavirus and/or job losses, unstable housing situations and other huge challenges.

The number of completed LBUSD applications for FAFSA and CADAA are down 19.3 percent. We have only been able to assist students virtually, so while we have not cancelled events, the participation is not what we normally are able to accommodate. Many school site and districtwide FAFSA events have taken place, yet our completion rates are lower than normal. Unfortunately, this problem is a nationwide trend. Our partners from Long Beach City College, Cal State Long Beach, Cal-SOAP and USC have all been attempting to help us to increase our completion rates, yet we are continuing to fall short compared to last year's data.

An extension of the deadline to April 2 would go a long way toward helping our students to complete these important applications. Our team of dedicated staff is ready to take full advantage of a deadline extension so that we can help many more students receive the help they need now more than ever.

In response to the Special Alert, 03/17/2021 GSA 2021-09, from the California Student Aid Commission, Mendota Unified School District would like to request a deadline postponement to allow our students from the graduating Class of 2021 to submit their 2021-2022 FAFSA or CADAA applications after the March 2nd deadline.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Mendota Unified School District has been administering remote learning since March 2020. As a result, this has brought about new challenges for our students. Particularly, our Seniors have experienced disruptions in their ability to apply for financial aid. Given that the majority of Mendota High students are first-generation and low-income, our families rely heavily on our counseling staff supporting them through the financial aid application process. However, in accordance with CDC and State of California directives, our high school cancelled all in person workshops. While our high school was able to conduct workshops in a virtual format, via Zoom, our district still has many students that live in remote, rural locations where they lack access to adequate and reliable internet. As a result, we had several students that experienced various technical difficulties that interfered with their ability to submit their 2021-22 FAFSA or CADAA application by the March 2nd deadline. Our high school counselors have determined that there are 30 students who were significantly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and as a result were unable to submit their 2021-2022 financial aid application by the state deadline. If Mendota Unified is granted the deadline postponement, these 30 students will have the opportunity to be considered for the Commission's financial programs and will be encouraged to pursue postsecondary education.

In the next couple of weeks, our school counselors and Cal-SOAP advisors will be communicating with our 30 students that could benefit from this opportunity to urge them to apply for financial aid. Our goal is to provide the opportunity to all graduating seniors at Mendota High School to apply for financial aid.

This pandemic has caused us to be holding school virtually since the fall. In our rural area, students and families have been limited in options or access to the internet. Families have had to extend working hours, taking on second jobs, or lost employment. Many students have had to take on employment to assist their families financially. Since students have not been on campus, they have not been able to receive the amount of support needed to complete their FAFSA or CA Dream Act applications. Due to internet issues, many students are not able to complete the application from home or their phones.

Our High School Counselor usually hosts 2 evening workshops on campus that had been postponed, then cancelled due to the ongoing covid-19 pandemic. This is in addition to the several mini workshops she usually holds in person on campus. Our county just moved into the Red tier, and we would be able to once again host a FAFSA workshop evening and day events to help support those families. We also will be having students on campus thus creating better access to completing the fafsa.

Our FAFSA completion rate has fallen about 20% from the previous year. An extension for our students is severely needed.

While in the purple tier, we enforced strict health and safety guidelines that have placed limitations in our ability to engage students within the local high school districts. As a result of moving into the red tier on March 17, we have noticed that high schools are now beginning to engage with students, therefore increasing their ability to engage students to apply for financial aid. With additional time, we believe that we can be instrumental in contributing to the success of our high school district colleagues who are working with students. According to "Race to Submit" Financial Aid applications completed by California Public High School students have decreased from 54.69% (year 2020) to 47.50% (year 2021). This is a clear indicator that the COVID-19 pandemic has negatively impacted our ability to serve students as we did prior to these unprecedented times.

The pandemic affected financial aid submissions in various ways. Because the district transitioned to distance learning, students did not have the same ease of access to presenters and drop-by visits to their counselors as they have in the past. Although information regarding financial aid was delivered to students, not all students have had equal access to quality internet service. Additionally, the increase in financial hardships for families made attending FAFSA informational events difficult for parents.

The high school counselors typically have FAFSA promotional events on campus that were effective at drawing in students and creating incentives to complete their FAFSA. These events were held during class, lunchtime, after school, and spontaneously in counselors' offices when students were able to drop by or when counselors were able to pull students from their classroom for check-ins. When we transitioned to distance learning, the virtual activities presented fewer opportunities for relatable incentives, were affected by students' access to high quality internet service, and were at times, difficult for parents to attend due to financial hardships. One example is the annual FAFSA prenet presentation by a local university partner. This event typically draws over 100 families and this year was attended by 17 families, despite multiple notices and a make-up presentation.

The Race To Submit dashboard for Monrovia High School shows the following changes between the Class of 2020 and the Class of 2021: FAFSA submission dropped by 6% while the completion rate dropped by 8%. The Cal Grant application rate dropped by 8% while the Cal Grant Awards rate dropped by 2%.

This letter serves as a formal request, by the Montebello Unified School District, to postpone the application deadline for the Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and California Dream Act application (CADAA).

Montebello Unified School District has conducted several virtual financial aid parent/student workshops, both at the district and school levels, to encourage our pupils to submit the FAFSA or CADAA applications. However, due to extenuating circumstances caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, several of our pupils' ability to complete their application were hampered by (1) limited time to gather the required information, (2) device and connectivity issues, (3) social and emotional issues, and (4) family health concerns.

These issues had an adverse impact on some of our students' ability to submit their financial aid applications by the established deadline. The data below illustrates a 5 percent drop in both submitted and completed FAFSA/Dream Act applications compared to the 2019-2020 academic school year.

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and stay-at-home order issued by the State of California as well as Los Angeles County, the Mt. SAC Financial Aid Office, along with the entire college, has had to close the campus to staff, faculty, students, and visitors. This directly negatively affected our ability to provide one-on-one personalized assistance to students and their families in completing their financial aid application in time to meet the established deadline. School closures and distance learning have affected all students, but it has disproportionately impacted students of color and students in low-income households that would directly benefit from financial aid programs with established deadlines such as the Cal Grant programs. Moreover, our Mt. SAC financial aid outreach events such as Cash for College are overwhelmingly attended by students of color. Adding to the adverse effects to distance learning, many students now have limited to no access to services that were offered by schools such as Mt. SAC. The ongoing pandemic and virtual learning setting has posed several challenges and barriers to students and families who do not have access or adequate access to technology and/or need personalized assistance completing their financial aid application. Many students and families are facing harsh financial and personal decisions that is affecting a student's commitment to completing a financial aid application by the established deadline and/or committing no asteres condary institution.

The Mt. SAC Financial Aid Office, in partnership with on- and off-campus programs and high schools, host two Cash for College events throughout the school year. We open up our campus to prospective families to provide one-on-one assistance with completing their FAFSA and California Dream Act Application. This is an interactive event where students and their families are reserved a computer desktop and receive personalized assistance in completing their application. For the 2019-2020 school year, over 613 students attended at least one of our two events. For the 2020-2021 school year, we presented these this event virtually and only 390 students attended. That is a 63.62% reduction in attendance. Further, in the fall of 2019, we had almost 80% of students report that they were able to complete and successfully submit their FAFSA or CADAA at our event in time for the priority deadline. In comparison, in fall of 2020, only 23.85% reported they were able to complete and successfully submit their FAFSA or CADAA during our virtual event. While we our virtual Cash for College events this school year were comprehensive in presenting the information needed for a student and their family to complete a FAFSA or CADAA, we recognize the many unique scenarios and personalized assistance that may be needed that a virtual event may not be able to fulfill. Therefore, our Office increased our 2021-2022 financial aid application outreach efforts. Both in the fall and currently, we hosted on a bi-weekly basis, virtual workshops where students were able to receive one-one-one personalized assistance completing FAFSA or CADAA. Additionally, we were intentional in increasing our partnerships with local high schools and on-campus programs to host financial aid workshops throughout the fall term in preparation for the priority deadline.

As of 3/31/2021, Mt. SAC's total number of 2021-2022 CADAA/FAFSA received is 19,334 which is 4,469 less than around this time last year for the 2020-2021 aid year. It is evident that extending the 2021-2022 application deadline to April 2, 2021 will be a tremendous help in supporting students achieving their educational goals.

Disruptions such as power outages, local maintenance, limited internet connections, etc. led to event cancellations. As a result, students were not able to complete financial aid applications confidently, in a timely manner, or at all. Events affected: October 9, 2020, November 19, 2020, December 2, 2020, December 3, 2020, December 10, 2020, January 19, 2021, February 10, 2021, February 11, 2021, February 23, 2021, February 25, 2021.

Oakland Unified School District has been heavily impacted by the COVID pandemic. Oakland had 3 zip codes with some of the highest COVID infection rates in the entire country during this school year. We are an urban district with many vulnerable students and socioeconomically disadvantaged families with 71.9% of our students qualifying for free and reduced lunch this school year. The pandemic resulted in significant economic challenges for our community as well as alarming COVID infection rates, particularly in East Oakland among our Latinx community.

We have been in distance learning since March and faced a deep technology divide in our district with many families lacking access to a computer and/or reliable internet. Among our high schools alone, one school reported as high as 91.8% of students with no computer at home. We have worked diligently to provide more technology access but there remain challenges to access and proficiency in order to support students and families to complete FAFSA and CADAA applications online with only remote support.

School sites typically offer multiple financial aid crunch sessions with extensive in-person support available for students and families with a focus on families who are most likely to struggle with completing these applications and students who are the first in their family to attend college. This is in addition to many Cash for College Sessions that happen in our schools that were forced to move to virtual events which limited access for certain families. The transition to virtual support and more individual support has been a tremendous challenge for school sites that typically conducted group support for financial aid and in-person support for high need students and families.

Additionally, issues of confidentiality have greatly complicated financial aid support, as screen sharing can only be done in break-out rooms with 1:1 student/staff support. This has led to students and families waiting for hours to receive help from trained staff, a situation that further disadvantages first-generation, non- English speaking families, and low-income families.

In 2020, 63% of students completed financial aid applications by March 2 2020, for a total of 1529 complete applications. In 2021, 60% of students have completed applications by the deadline, with a total of 1361 complete applications.

In a report run March 15, 2021, 20 applications are tagged as being submitted past the March 2nd deadline. This number will continue to increase as students submit financial aid. Each late application represents students who will have greatly diminished financial aid options due largely to the difficulty of supporting students to complete applications through distance learning.

School sites are diligently working to continue supporting students and families to apply for financial aid. Because of the remote nature of this year, it is all the more time-consuming and challenging. We are seeing more students submitting late applications than we are accustomed to, which tells us there was student interest in applying to financial aid but there was not enough support to submit on-time applications. This is a particular disadvantage to AB540 students who are most impacted by missing the March 2nd Cal Grant Deadline.

Palomar College respectfully requests the Commission to grant an additional 30 calendar days beyond the March 2, 2021 deadline for students who were unable to submit their 2021-22 FAFSA or CADAA application due to disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic or other "qualifying event" as defined in CEC Section 69513.2.(d).

Until March 17, San Diego County remained in the purple tier of the Governor's Blueprint for a Safer Economy. While in the purple tier, we enforced strict health and safety guidelines that have placed limitations in our ability to engage students within the local high school districts. As a result of moving into the red tier on March 17, we have noticed that high schools are now beginning to engage with students, therefore increasing their ability to engage students to apply for financial aid. With additional time, we believe that we can be instrumental in contributing to the success of our high school district colleagues who are working with students. According to "Race to Submit" Financial Aid applications completed by California Public High School students have decreased from 54.69% (year 2020) to 47.50% (year 2021). This is a clear indicator that the COVID-19 pandemic has negatively impacted our ability to serve students as we have done previous to this unprecedented time.

Palomar College is committed to ensuring equitable access to higher education for students with financial barriers. We appreciate your consideration to extend the deadline for our students to participate in California State aid. We feel strongly that increased allowability in awards will assist in the overall success rates of our students, in result positively impacting degree attainment, and economic mobility amongst our minoritized students.

To Whom It May Concern:

I am writing this letter on behalf of the Paramount Unified School District (PUSD) to formally request a deadline postponement from the California Student Aid Commission that will provide our students additional time to submit their FAFSA or CADA applications as allowed by California Education Code (CEC) section 69513.2.

Our district has engaged in distance learning for the entire 2020-2021 school year so far; our Governing Board recently decided that we will close this school year in this format. As a result, we have had no choice but to support nearly 1,200 seniors and their families with completing their financial aid paperwork entirely online. As I am sure the Commission will acknowledge, successfully completing and submitting the FAFSA/CADA can be intimidating for students, especially those who will be first-generation college attendees, under normal circumstances and conditions. Unfortunately, that COVID-19 pandemic has made this even more challenging for our students as we have been forced to rely on using Zoom, phone calls, emails, and other digital communications to support the application process.

Under normal circumstances, we provide our seniors and their families with a series of workshops and seminars about the college and financial aid application processes. While we have continued to offer these, attendance has been significantly decreased since they may only be conducted online. We also traditionally use class time to work individually with seniors on their financial aid paperwork. Unfortunately, due to the limited amount of instructional time that we can provide via distance learning, we have not been able to continue this practice.

Despite our best efforts, we are very concerned about the progress that our seniors have made thus far toward submitting their FAFSA/CADA applications. According to the federal database, as of March 5, 2021, FAFSA applications for the Class of 2021 are down about 1/3 from levels one year ago (508 this year compared to 745 one year ago). The additional time allowed by the Commission will allow our students and staff to work together to improve these figures and bring them to at least equivalent levels achieved in prior years.

The additional 30-day deadline extension will allow seniors and families the extra time to complete the necessary application requirements, with virtual support from their PUC School & College Counselors, along with virtual Cash for College workshops.

#### QUALIFYING EVENT

The COVID-19 pandemic caused disruption to PUC Schools' five high schools, moving students from in-person instruction to virtual instruction for the end of their junior year (March 2020) and their entire senior school year to date. With the uncertainty of the pandemic, seniors and families have been hesitant to complete financial aid applications and commit to a post-high school plan.

#### FINANCIAL AID OUTREACH EVENTS

PUC Schools traditionally provide a variety of in-person financial aid information and planning workshops that countdown to the applications launch on October 1sth through to the March 2<sup>nd</sup> deadline. Family and senior engagement has decreased at financial aid workshops from prior years, which we believe is attributed to a variety of personal struggles throughout the communities we serve. Below is a list of financial aid events that have been canceled, delayed and/or moved to virtual services:

- <u>Senior Institutes</u> (CANCELED) Summer, in-person, multi-day workshops that educate students and families regarding the financial aid processes, required documentation, timeline and external financial aid supports.
- <u>FAFSA & CADAA Application Workshops</u> (DELAYS) Financial Aid professionals support students with completing their FAFSA or CADAA applications. Attendance at virtual workshops was not as high as previous years' in-person workshops
- Individual Financial Aid Application Support (DELAYS) An increase in individual FAFSA and CADAA counseling session were
  provided from previous years, which caused delays in providing support to all students.

#### REDUCED COMPLETION OF FAFSA & CADAA APPLICATIONS

When comparing PUC-Wide Class of 2020's to the Class of 2021's FAFSA and CADAA completion data across our 5 PUC high schools, we see a decrease in application completion by 4% to date:

- Class of 2020 79% Completion
- Class of 2021 75% Completion

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, our high school/school district closed in mid-March 2020. Under local and county guidance, our school began and continued distance learning into the 2020-2021 school year. In November 2020, our school offered hybrid instruction, where students were given the option to attend in-person 2 days of the week. Of our 108 seniors, only 31 have chosen the hybrid model, making it much more difficult to meet the needs of both hybrid and distance learning students to attend both in-person and online financial aid workshops and events. With the absence of in-person support and minimal to non-existent attendance with financial aid workshops and the cancellation of Cash for College Financial Aid advisor support, our seniors' ability to submit financial aid applications has diminished during the pandemic.

Due to the pandemic, we were unable to host our twice annual in-person Cash for College financial aid workshops in both fall and spring semesters. Workshops were offered during class and after school through zoom, but the low number of applications submitted suggest that in-person, hands-on support is preferred and needed to ensure students and families can apply and get questions answered easily versus through remote operations.

According to data from this year (2021) and the previous year (2020), only 68 of our seniors completed a FAFSA or CADAA application vs last year's seniors of which 93 completed an application. 92 seniors last year were able to complete their Cal Grant Application versus this year, in which only 66 seniors show completing their application.

We are our small, rural school district, located in a rural, farm town of Riverdale. Our students and families are predominately Hispanic, Spanish-speaking, and first generation college bound students. These students' lack of college mentors and role models at home limit their access to information and resources that only our school can provide. With most seniors on distance learning, we ask that the Cal Grant deadline be extended for our students so more can be considered for Cal Grant eligibility. We recognize many are already considering work or currently working, yet desire to attend college. If the flexibility to offer them the extension is granted, this would help some more students be able to apply and become eligible to attend college with financial aid support. Thank you for considering our request to postpone the deadline.

Students have experienced a financial crisis due to loss of employment and income. As a result, students are suffering from depression and anxiety and need support . Low income students without internet access fall in the widening digital gap and lack access to complete a FAFSA or Dream Act application. Outreach activities served 96% less students on a 1V1 basis for the 20-21 application cycle in the remote workshop environment vs on/off campus in person workshops in 19-20. Although presentations and information sessions were provided and attended, assistance with step by step application completion was a challenge in the remote learning environment. This lack of ability to assist students with 1 to 1 hands on application assistance is directly impacted by the COVID 19 pandemic

Monterey County was declared a Natural Disaster area by the Governor as a result of the wild fires that affected the many areas, predominantly the unincorporated area of Salinas, where a good number of the students that attend Salinas High School live. The fires devastated the vegetation, as well as impacted the air quality for our entire county. The impact of the wild fires is still being felt, as the recent rain storms caused mud and land slides, again displacing people from their homes as well as from jobs in the surrounding agricultural fields. COVID 19, along with the natural disasters we've experienced have impacted students access to reliable Internet connectivity that has impacted the ability to successfully complete school work, including FAFSA/CADAAA completion.

With approximately 76% of our high school student population meeting the criteria of socio-economically disadvantaged, a deadline extension could benefit a great number of students who would otherwise miss out on Cal Grant monies for both Dreamers and residents alike.

Districtwide school closures from 3/13/2020 through the end of the 2020-2021 school year due to the COVID-19 pandemic have added a significant barrier for students and families applying for financial aid. While school counselors and college & career resource teachers (CCRTs) have done their best to host workshops and share information in the virtual world, their ability to reach students to offer support completing FAFSA/CADAAin a timely manner has been greatly diminished. Additionally, given the newness of our situation and families' understandable concerns about sharing sensitive information in the digital school world, it has been very difficult for counselors and CCRTs to get the information needed from families for their students' FAFSA/CADAAapplications.

All in-person Cash for Colleges workshops were canceled and replaced with virtual workshops. We appreciate that CSAC made this transition for the safety of all, and we are proud of our counselors and college & career resource teachers' hard work scheduling and publicizing them. However, it is our observation that the move to virtual workshops contributed to a decreased level of trust and engagement with students and parents applying for financial aid, which is reflected in the data below. During the COVID-19 school closures, our district's chronic absenteeism rate spiked to nearly 25%, which meant even fewer students engaged and decreased educators access to offer support on financial aid applications.

In 2020, 51% of our San Bernardino City USD 12th graders (1798 of 3482 enrolled) submitted a FAFSAor CADAA, but so far in 2021, only 40% (1401 of 3490 enrolled) have done so, representing a 21.6% decrease in percentage from 2020 to 2021. The drop in the percentage of students who actually completed their FAFSA/CADAAwas slightly greater: In 2020, 47% of our seniors (1650 of 3482 enrolled) completed their FAFSA/CADAAwas slightly greater: In 2020, 47% of our seniors (1650 of 3482 enrolled) completed their FAFSA/CADAA, but as of 3/21/2021, only 35% of this year's seniors (1242 of 3490 enrolled) had completed it--a drop of 25.5% between 2020 when all applications were submitted before COVID-19 school closure, and 2021 when we have been in distance learning for over a year. We are working as a district to shore up district-wide systems to ensure all students have support completing the FAFSA/CADAA application process. We have a robust plan to reach and support students in the week of March 29-April 1, including sharing of information with students by email, mass notification and flyers, and are also creating large-group and one-to-one support opportunities for students who will help completing financial aid applications during spring break.

The COVID-19 pandemic forced the campus to close to the public and group events were limited to 10 people or less. One-on-one, in-person assistance completing the FAF8A and CA Dream Act Application with the help of office staff ceased and large scale financial aid in-reach events (4 Financial Aid Awareness Fairs) were also canceled since mid-March 2020. One-on-once assistance aids students that had difficulty filing out their financial aid application. The Awareness Fairs dates were planned in the spring semester to be prior to March 2 to remind students to apply, in mid-May to remind students enrolled in summer classes to apply for the fall semester, and the second week of October in Fall semester to remind students to apply for the new school year application. These events increased completion rates, and without these outreach events it is very likely the on-time completion rate for both the FAF8A and Cal Dream Act have reduced.

JCCS serves at-promise youth who have historically been marginalized and who greatly benefit from the in-person mentoring relationships provided by our amazing staff. It's their trauma-informed, resorative approach that makes the difference in helping our young poeple tum their stubling blocks into stepping stones. We greive the moments of community building that were taken away from us and institutionalized inequities have only grown more glaring. Additionally, in person completion of the FAFSA allows us to work with families whose traumic experiences have created distrust in answering social security or financial records questions. Together, we would speak to their concerns and have a greater FAFSA completion rate.

Also, the ability to be able to schedule sufficent time to complete the entire FASA in one sitting was compromised due to many of our seniors taking on new responsibilities due to the pandemic (such as part time/full time jobs and caregiving responsibilities for younger siblings or older family members). Those students who were able to complete the FASA did so over multiple working sessions with staff, which significantly impacted the number of students we could help through the entire process.

Dear CSAC,

San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD) is requesting a deadline postponement to allow students enrolled in our city and county to submit their 2021-22 FAFSA or CADAA applications after the March 2, 2021 deadline.

- Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, our high schools have not been open so far for inperson learning. Low income, homeless and immigrant populations have been severely impacted by not having access to reliable technology and/or internet connections. School staff has had a very difficult time reaching these families to support their senior year and college process.
- 2. Cash for College events moved to 100% virtual, however, families who did not have technology access were excluded from these events. The following workshops were cancelled due to the pandemic at all of our 22 high schools:
  - a. In-person financial aid workshops at each high school (Oct 2020- Feb 2021)
  - b. In-person computer lab drop-in at lunch and after school (Oct 2020-Feb 2021)
  - c. In-person student/family sessions to complete the FAFSA/CADAA
- The class of 2019 FAFSA/CADAA completion rate was 81%, the class of 2020 completion rate was 76% (in-person school closed March 17<sup>th</sup>), and the class of 2021 current rate of completion is about 60% (high schools have been virtual since August 2020). Without the ability to support students and families in person, the most disadvantaged students and families will be most impacted.

Please approve a 30-day extension for SFUSD to allow the students more time to complete their financial aid applications and qualify for a Cal Grant.

SJUSD is requesting a postponement due to the impact that COVID-19 pandemic has had on our community. The COVID-19 pandemic has resulted in economic and social/emotional disruption for our students and families. Many of our families have been dealing with the loss of employment, the loss of loved ones, the loss of in person schooling, the loss of routine, the loss of social connection, which has resulted in higher degrees of trauma.

If no events have been affected, please leave this section blank. Due to the pandemic we had to modify our annual financial aid kick off event to a virtual setting which was voluntary. Prior to the pandemic the FAFSA kick off event was in person during the school day and seniors were required to attend. In previous years we had many seniors complete the FAFSA during the kick off event because we were able to have greater access to motivate seniors to apply (i.e. school assembly, give aways, ability to talk to students in person about the advantages of completing the FAFSA). Due to the pandemic we were unable to offer in person FAFSA workshops and were only able to offer virtual workshops. This has impacted the number of parents who attend.

All of our high schools in SJUSD have had a decrease this year in completion of the financial aid application. In March 2020 San Jacinto High School had 64% of seniors complete the FAFSA, compared to March of 2021 53% of seniors completed the FAFSA. Our alternative high schools, Mountain View High had a 22% completion rate in March 2020, compared to an 11% completion rate in March 2021, Mountain Heights Academy had a 17% completion in March of 2020 and a 6% completion rate in March 2021 (data taken from California Student Aid Commission).

4. Additional comments (if any): Thank you for your consideration of the postponement of the March 2nd deadline. We believe that many of our seniors will benefit by this postponement.

Due to disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, San Juan Unified School District students' access to support and resources has been hindered, as we have been operating under full distance learning since the beginning of the 2020-2021 school year. To the California Student Aid Commission,

I am writing to request a 30-day extension of the Cal Grant deadline for financial aid applicants from the San Mateo Union High School District. As Superintendent, and in conjunction with our school counselors and financial aid experts at each district site, I have seen the challenges that COVID-19 has brought on in completing this essential step in the college process, especially for our most vulnerable populations.

We have seen a drop in our overall numbers of submitted FAFSA and CA Dream Act applications district wide compared to last year. As of March 14, only 54.12% of our students had submitted an application compared to 55.70% last year. The biggest decrease has been with the completed numbers of applications that also contain a GPA verification. Last year at this time we had 52.58% of students reporting as submitted compared to 42.17% this year. A significant reason for the downturn in applications is the large number of first generation students in our district in need of additional support with the financial aid process. Typically, these students and families are able to bring their family tax forms to our College and Career Centers to get individual support. With the virtual learning environment many of these students have encountered barriers to being able to complete these forms at home, or were not able to access virtual help. Our staff and students are returning to school this week and we would like another chance to communicate with these students and families to offer additional in-person support that they may need in completing the required forms.

Please consider this 30-day extension for the San Mateo Union High School District in regards to Cal Grant consideration. Our dedicated staff, particularly our College & Financial Aid Advisors, have been working hard with students on these issues and will continue to do so. We realize that this request may make your staff's work more difficult. We will encourage our students to file financial aid requests as far in front of the deadlines as possible. I thank you very much for taking the time to review this request.

Please approve the deadline postponement of the 2021-22 FAFSA and CADAA applications for students in Santa Barbara Unified School District from March 2, 2021 to April 1, 2021.

Per your communication on March 17, 2021, the California Student Aid Commission may grant an additional 30 calendar days beyond the March 2, 2021 deadline for students who were unable to submit their 2021-22 FAFSA or CADAA application due to disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic as defined in Section 69513.2.(d).

COVID-19 has had an adverse effect on our student's ability to submit their financial aid applications by the established deadline since we have had to rely on internet connectivity and access to technology devices to connect with our students and families. As over half of the students in our district qualify as socio-economically disadvantaged, we have deployed 1:1 devices for all of our students as well as mobile hotspot devices for families without internet service. Unfortunately, we have seen an increase in chronic absenteeism as well as an increase in our D/F rates across all demographic groups, and we know that we are not consistently connecting with all of our students and families.

In prior years, our district has used the month of October to have counseling staff go into every single Economics and Government class, which are required for all of our senior students, and conduct presentations on Financial Aid. From these presentations, we have historically been able to promote Financial Aid workshops facilitated by our staff, or the Cash-to-College Workshops hosted by the CA Student Aid Commission. We have also used the class time to identify students who may need additional support and sign them up for workshops directly. Unfortunately, because our district was in remote learning, we were unable to meet with each Economics and Government class to give Financial Aid presentations and promote Financial Aid support. This meant that while we still hosted virtual Financial Aid workshops, the number of students who participated in those workshops was significantly lower than in previous years. All attempts were made to reach out to students via parent messaging and social media campaigns, but as previously mentioned, many of our families are struggling with connectivity because of the pandemic.

While we are still collecting data on the number of students in our district who have successfully completed FAFSA or CADAA applications for 2021-22, we know from a letter sent on February 24, 2021 by Tony Thurmond, CA Superintendent of Public Education, that CA is experiencing an 11% decrease in FAFSA forms completed when compared to prior years. We anticipate similar numbers in our district.

We are asking that the Commission please deem that all Santa Barbara Unified students who file a FAFSA or CADAA between March 2, 2021 and April 2, 2021 as on-time applications. Thank you for your consideration.

On behalf of the Santa Maria Joint Union High School District, I am requesting that the California Student Aid Commission grant our students April 1, 2021, FAFSA submission deadline.

The data collected by the Central Coast Cal-SOAP reflects 30 in-person Cash for College events scheduled to take place from October 1, 2020, to March 2, 2021. However, due to COVID-19, in September 2020, we had to make an immediate shift from providing services from our traditional in-person, one-on-one assistance model at each of our feeder high schools to an online-remote zoom session by appointment model.

The data attached reflects that there was a significant drop in attendance at the online-remote zoom sessions. For example, Pioneer Valley High School, with the highest number of seniors, dropped from a typical turnout of 100-120 seniors per night to nine seniors. In order to counter the significant loss of participation, in collaborations with Allan Hancock College, students were provided financial aid assistance over winter break between December 14, 2020, and January 15, 2021. These additional efforts helped increase senior applications by another 214 students. However, our overall numbers continued to be below our numbers from 2019.

Overall, Central Coast Cal-SOAP and AHC's financial aid department would assist 1,200 -1,400 high school seniors with financial aid applications. For the 2020-2021 year, our numbers were reduced to 673 or half of the seniors typically served.

Upon reflection, assisting high school seniors via zoom took more time and effort and did not provide a pathway toward completion for a significant number. In addition, it was much more challenging to assist students over zoom because of the complexity of the required tax documents. It may be possible that there may be an increase in errors as financial aid assistants needed to rely on the parents and students to locate the correct data on their tax forms.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we are requesting a deadline postponement to allow students to submit their 2021-22 FAFSA or CADAA applications by April 1<sup>st</sup>, and still be considered for Cal Grant entitlement eligibility.

- Completion rates for 2021-22 FAFSA and CADAA in the far north state are much lower than they were in 2020-21. Our far north state area is economically depressed, as evidenced by the percentage of free/reduced meals eligible K-12 population (in the table below). Cal Grant is a critical component of our students' ability to finance their college education.
  - As of 3/17/21, we have downloaded 4,328 2021-22 FAFSAs. That is only 83% of the previous year's amount (5,180 2020-21 FAFSAs downloaded by 3/24/20)

- 2) The switch at Shasta College from 70% in-person classes/30% online classes to roughly 10% in-person classes/90% online classes has been less attractive to a number of our current and prospective students. Our Fall 2020 and Spring 2021 semester enrollments were down approximately 20-21% from the year before. We anticipate a slight increase in in-person classes for Fall 2021, but plan to continue primarily online. While some of our local high school seniors move out of the area to attend four-year universities, the majority of them attend our college each year. We believe the COVID-necessary shift to mostly online coursework is creating less enthusiasm for enrollment, and in turn, for financial aid application submissions.
- 3) Shasta College financial aid staff normally support our local high schools' in-person Cash for College workshops throughout Shasta, Tehama, and Trinity Counties, our service area. Our counties have been in the Purple Tier since mid-October, which prevented these in-person gatherings. As a rural area, we have many students who do not have adequate broadband access at home, which limited virtual events. Additionally high school counselors who normally are able to focus on helping seniors complete financial aid applications have been stretched thin by the complications of the pandemic.

We worked throughout the year with our high school partners and our current college student population to encourage FAFSA and CADAA completion through direct messaging, social media, and direct assistance (via phone and Zoom). With a large marketing push about the March 2<sup>nd</sup> deadline, we saw a substantial increase in completion the very last week of February. That was before our campus' announcement that additional coursework would be taught in-person this fall. If given an extension of the deadline, I believe that we can stimulate additional interest in financial aid application completion in the next two weeks before April 1.

Skyline College, OPEID 007713 is submitting this letter in response to **GSA 2021-09 2021-22 Application Deadline Postponement Request** issued by the California Student Aid Commission (CSAC) on March 17, 2021. We are requesting a deadline postponement to allow students to submit their 2021-22 FAFSA or CADAA applications after the March 2, 2021 deadline as a result of the impact COVID-19 continues to have on the lives of the students and families served by our college.

In accordance with the provisions set forth in California Education Code Section 69513.2, the basis for this request is due to the declaration of both a national and state emergency still in effect as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. This ongoing crisis has caused a disruption in our services and students' varying abilities to receive the support and assistance needed from financial aid and other professional staff to meet the March 2, 2021 for FAFSA and CADAA submission deadline for consideration of the Cal Grant, Middle Class Scholarship and other CSAC programs.

Feedback from college personnel that oversee many of our equity-centered programs state a steep drop-off in student contact as the effects of the pandemic continue to disproportionately impact our highest need communities from which we draw many of our students. These programs have long relied upon evidence-based data to implement activities and follow-up services that engage and retain our students.

The inability to meet with students in-person for one-on-one and group activities including weekly financial aid application workshops has resulted in fewer of our students meeting critical deadlines including March 2, 2021 to submit their 2021-22 FAFSA or CADAA applications. Our college's applications are down 22.1% over last year's as of the March 2<sup>nd</sup> annual deadline and down by almost 20% as a three-college district.

St. HOPE Public Schools requests a deadline postponement for Sacramento Charter High School students to submit their 2021-2022 FAFSA or CADAA applications after the March 2, 2021 deadline.

A large number of students were unable to submit their 2021-2022 FAFSA or CADAA application due to disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Our district hosted one Cash4College workshop on October 14, 2020 and attendance was so low in comparison to previous years that we held an additional Cash4College workshop on November 17, 2020. Even with this additional workshop there has been a large reduction in the number of students who have completed a financial aid application this school year:

- In the 19-20 school year, 89% of seniors submitted their FAFSA or CADAA
- In the 20-21 school year, currently 63% of seniors have submitted their FAFSA or CADAA

Remote learning has had an adverse effect on students' ability to submit their financial aid applications as seen by this year's notable drop in submissions compared to the 19-20 school year. Additional challenges our students have faced in submitting financial aid applications include: Unreliable home internet access; parents/guardians working longer hours, making it difficult for the student to gather their parents/guardians' financial information; and minimal computer experience, making it difficult for both students and families to access Zoom workshops and progress through a financial aid application without in-person support. For these reasons, St. HOPE Public Schools requests a deadline postponement for Sacramento Charter High School students to submit 2021-2022 FAFSA or CADAA applications after the March 2, 2021 deadline.

Due to COVID-19, our students and prospects have had diminished support and reinforcement for filing the FAFSA. Nationally, filing rates for high school seniors has trended downward by 15% or more over prior years. From our regional high school counselors, we know that a significant contributor to this trend is that their attenion has to be focused on basic needs counseling for students in crisis during this time, so there is minimized support for college preparation counseling. As the region downgrades in state monitoring from most severe, there is now increased opportunity for students to seek and receive support for FAFSA filing, but doing so would be later than the March 2 deadline.

Our internal records indicate that applications for both new and continuing students remains below prior year filing rates by over 10%. The trendline has improved from an initial gap of 20%, and the improvement has been later breaking (late February through March, rather then January).

Our students are heavily dependent upon Cal Grant support to maintain their education - we are a federally designated HSI with nearly 50% of all undergraduates receiving Pell Grant funds. Over 25% of our total undergraduate population receives Cal Grant assistance annually, so a loss of this resource due to COVID-19 impacts on counseling support would substantially harm our students' success.

To whom it may concern,

Thank you to the California Student Aid Commission (CSAC) for allowing institutions the opportunity to request a deadline postponement to allow students who submitted their 2021-22 FAFSA between March 2-April 2, 2021 to be deemed on-time applications for Cal Grant consideration.

Vanguard University is requesting consideration for this application deadline postponement for its current and new incoming students for the 2021-22 FAFSA/academic year.

- 1. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, only approximately 20% of currently enrolled undergraduate and graduate students are on-campus for curricular or co-curricular programming or residence life. New incoming fall 2021 prospective students were not allowed to visit campus until after February 1, 2021 due to the CA stay-at-home order and Blueprint for a Safer Economy colorcoded tier system.
- 2. For the 2020-21 FAFSA/academic year, the COVID-19 pandemic did not impact on-campus curricular or co-curricular programming or residence life until after the March 2 FAFSA deadline.
- 3. As a result, financial aid outreach events could not be maximized as in previous years. In previous years, on-campus promotion of the March 2 FAFSA deadline has included posters, flyers and table tents being placed around campus. In-person FAFSA labs and workshops could not be conducted. Virtual engagement with students has been minimal due to disengagement due to virtual overload from academic instruction.
- 4. At present, 15% of new incoming fall 2021 accepted students have not submitted their FAFSA of which 75% are CA residents. Approximately 50% of traditional undergraduates are Cal Grant and/or Pell Grant eligible students. Allowing students who submit the FAFSA by April 2 to be considered for state grant eligibility would allow Vanguard University to best serve its student population that typically demonstrates significant financial need.

Vanguard University appreciates the CSAC considering this request.

They or their parents have experienced loss of employment. They may be dealing with sick family members or have been sick themselves, or dealing with loss of loved ones. These events and switching to remote learning has caused a disruption in learning.

We work with our high schools and local communities but with move to remote learning and social distance guidelines we have seen less opportunity to provide information to the community

Last year we imported a total of 18,402 Fafsa applications. This year the number was 15,193, for around a 17% decrease.

Due to the disruption caused by COVID-19 state of emergency declared by the President of the United States, Yosemite Community College District is requesting an extension to the March 2nd deadline to allow students to submit their 2021-22 FAFSA and/or California Dream Application after March 2, 2021. The pandemic has created multiple barriers for students such as: fimited access to technology and Internet; limited access to knowledgeable achool professionals, and reduce access to workshops/web/nars. Along with barriers, the pandemic has brought uncertainty from students of what college is going to book like with COVID. Students are waiting longer to make the decision to decided to apply and attend college.

In person events that are held on high school campus have been canceled for over a year reducing our access to the graduating cantors. Additionally, events that are currently been held are via Zoom limiting us to working with students one-on-one and not in large group setting as in the past.

According to the Race To Submit website, all of the serving areas for Yosemite Community College District show a decrease in FAFSA/CADAA submissions. In 2020, Stanislads County had a 50% submission rate, San Joaquin Count 46%, Tuolumne County 46% and Calaveras County 54% submission rate. For class of 2021 we see a decrease of FAFSA/CADAA submission that range between 8 to 11% reduction. Districts such as Cereas Unified are showing a decline in FAFSA/CADAA submission from 2020 to 2021 of 17%; Patterson Joant Unified are seeing a decline of 21%; Riverbank Unified is experiencing a 15% decline and Modesto City High School District is seeing a 11% decline in FAFSA/CADAA submissions. In the more social economic rural counties of Tuolumne and Calaveras, Soncra High School shows a 14% decline and Summervite High School shows a 31% decline. If we segregate the data by schools the disparities among high schools' FAFSA/CADAA submission range between 10% to 30%

The rual area disconnect is real. Even though we push and push for students to complete their FAFSA by March 2nd we still have issues with getting them to do it. A lot of it is because of the area we live in and the lack of parent support some of our students have.
