Given the impact of the pandemic on the low income families we serve, graduating seniors most affected by poverty are prioritizing the immediate financial concerns of their families over college plans. Therefore, additional time is needed for outreach and to create incentives to engage seniors in the FAFSA application process.

Our community partner's sponsorship of FAFSA completion for our foster youth with incentive gift cards is pending.

To date, only 14% of ABCUSD eligible foster students have completed FAFSA (2022-23).

Homeless and foster students' conflicting responsibilities compete heavily with educational goals in the post-secondary environment. Additional time will allow for students to engage in and navigate the FAFSA process.

Due to the pandemic, the California Student Aid Commission (CSAC) is allowing districts and institutions to request postponement of the application deadline for the FAFSA/CADAA. Districts interested in doing this must submit a form found HERE by March 7<sup>th</sup> that will allow students an additional 30 calendar days beyond the March 2<sup>nd</sup>priority deadline to submit their applications and be counted as "on-time." This is a good opportunity to allow students an extra month (if needed) to complete their applications given the impact of COVID. We have seen a dramatic drop in the number of students completing FAFSA, college applications, and meeting other district/site deadlines. Our families and commuity have been impacted by unemployment, recent loss of jobs, and stable housing. Our district has been impacted with a staff shortage for 2 years.

Our high schools have hosted in-person and virtual FAFSA support workshops for students during and after the school day. Some events were cancelled due to a lack of student participation. In the past, we had a large turnout to fafsa workshops and a high completion rate.

Please accept this letter as Allan Hancock College's (AHC) request for the 2022-2023 Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and California Dream Act Application (CDAA) application deadline postponement. We will demonstrate utilizing completion data that students within the AHC District deserve to have their financial aid application extension approved due to the continued and varied in-person restrictions due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The data collected by the Central Coast Cal-SOAP office reflects that AHC offered 24 in-person Cash for College events and six zoom sessions that took place from October 1, 2021 - March 2, 2022. Even though Cash for College events were offered in-person at various high school locations, there was lower attendance than anticipated, and continued lower numbers than pre-pandemic time.

As of February 28, 2022, Central Coast Cal-SOAP and AHC's Financial Aid department assisted 1,742 high school seniors with financial aid applications in the pre-pandemic year of 2019-2020. For the 2021-2022 year, we served 1,478 students, which is a decrease of 10 percent from the 2020-2021 year, and a 15 percent decrease from the pre-pandemic year of 2019-2020. (NOTE: AHC still has four more events up to the March 2<sup>nd</sup> Cal Grant deadline; however, to meet the March 7<sup>th</sup> deadline for this request, the data is currently not available.)

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Due to the adverse effects of COVID-19 positivity rates and the subsequent need for quarantining meant that scholars were unable to either be present or get the support they needed to complete the financial aid application. These positivity rates are especially high in Los Angeles County, where all of our high schools are located.

A significant number of financial aid outreach events in January - specifically workshops had to be cancelled or postponed due to the Omicron surge that lead to large number of student and staff absences.

To date, only 50% of Alliance scholars have completed a financial aid application which is below our pacing for the class of 2020 - the last class who's financial aid completion wasn't impacted directly by COVID (Lockdown started after the financial aid window closed.)

Due to an unusually high absentee rate for both students and staff, many of our programs to promote FAFSA have been cancelled or have had very low attendance. This has resulted in many of our students being unable to get the assistance we would normally provide to assist with filling out the FAFSA form. The State of California has, and continues to be in a State of Emergency regarding the Covid Pandemic and Riverside County has been struck particularly hard by Covid.

Schools have sent daily text to families that have not completed their FAFSA paperwork. Bilingual Instructional Aides have been given additional hours to follow up with calls or emails to these families. The schools have held mandatory assemblies for the remaining seniors during the school day to explain the importance of the FAFSA to these students. The schools have held afterschool virtual parent/student FAFSA workshops.

At this time AUSD has a completion rate of 34% for applications for the class of 2022. For the class of 2021, that number was 48%. Based on this data from the Californa Dashboard, we are down 14% district wide.

Many of our students have also been called upon for childcare when thier younger siblings become ill and have to stay home from school. As our students become ill, they must stay home to recover. The effects of the COVID-19 pandemic have left students with limited time and limited access to complete the FAFSA or CADAA.

Due to COVID-19, staffing shortages among schools and support agencies are at an all-time high, staff and student absences, illnesses, and hospitalization are at unprecedented levels, and many of the venues and paths of in-person support have been significantly reduced in response to public health and safety concerns.

Numbers of all FAFSA events, including but not limited to Parent Universities on Financial Aid (both virtual and in-person events) declined significantly due to Covid constraints.

Current Race to Submit data shows AVUHSD down 11% in FAFSA completion and submission rates when compared to 2021.

In addition to all of the aforementioned reasons, we found it common that parents were not comfortable talking about specific financial aspects related to FAFSA/CADAA via an online setting, making it difficult to support them in completing their students' applications. The Covid-19 pandemic has had major, detremential effects on Bassett Unifed students' ability to successfully complete a financial aid application. Postitive Covid-19 cases at our highschool led to groups of students being placed in quarantine for days at a time, and individual/small in-school financial aid workshop sessions were canceled, rescheduled, or capacity restricted due to staff or students falling ill or having to be placed in isolation. Additionally, the pandemic has had a negative impact on the mental health of even our highest-achieving students, with some displaying a lack of intristic motivation and sharing that family loss and the transition to in-person learning has made it difficult to stay engaged in their scholarly duties.

Bassett High School shares information regarding all of CSAC's Cash for College online events to our families, however a large percentage of our families prefer in-person assistance due to digital literacy challenges, or due to unique tax or personal situations. To accomodate this, Bassett High School has always hosted in-person events on the weekends during December, and we planned to hold more during the months of January and February. However, early-mid January events were cancelled due to the Omnicron surge, and our February events were sparsely attended with the main reason shared for not attending being coronavirus concerns. As stated previously, in-school workshops and sessions also suffered from low attendance due to positive Covid-19 cases, mandatory isolation protocols, and family concerns regarding the Covid-19 virus.

Bassett High School had an ~70% FAFSA/CA Dream Act completion rate at the same time last year during the 2021-22 cycle. This year (2022-23), Bassett has an internal number of about ~55% FAFSA/CA Dream Acts Applications completed, a ~15% decrease that mirrors California's statewide trend.

Bassett Unified has always prided itself in ensuring that every student who wishes to pursue a post-secondary education or program has the support necessary to complete a financial aid application. Bassett will continue to work diligently to ensure our students submit before the March 2nd deadline. An additional 30 days however, would allow our Counseling Team to ensure that any student who has been adversely affected by the Covid-19 pandemic can still make the priority deadline and would greatly increase the number of completed applications for the 2022-23 cycle.

The transition from distance learning to on campus instruction has had many adverse effects on our students academically and emotionally causeing efforts and resources to be focused on these needs. Additionally the number of restrictions in terms of number of students allowed in indoor spaces to the restictions of visitors on campus has lowered the participation of parent/guardian attendance and assistance in completing the financial aid applications.

Due to the covid pandemic restrictions we have had to limit the number of workshops that are held on campus, after school or on the weekends. We have opted to provide these events virtually however attendance has been significantly lower compared to prior to Covid. Subsequently parents have not been able to attend our workshops and this creates a lot of back and forth between students and parents to access financial information to complete the applications.

The Coronavirus pandemic has continued to be an ongoing challenge in how we conduct outreach and provide support for application completion. We conducted several virtual financial aid application events with very low participation. Coordination with K-12, students and families have been a significant challenge along with limited access to technology for families, especially in rural counties like ours.

The COVID-19 pandemic has had a severe adverse effect on on-time FAFSA filing for soon to be high school graduates, especially those in low income and minority serving high schools. California Baptist University is a Hispanic-Serving Institution with 36% of CBU's undergraduate population being Hispanic. There are many articles from reliable higher education sources citing that FAFSA applications are lagging for the 2022/2023 school year among high school seniors. We feel that allowing our students' FAFSA applications that are submitted by April 1st to qualify as meeting the traditional March 2nd Cal Grant deadline will have a huge impact on our new students' ability to afford college.

Employees from CBU's Financial Aid Office coordinate, run, and attend many financial aid workshops for high school seniors to promote on time FAFSA filing. Typically, these workshops are held during school time or immediately after school at local high schools where our Financial Aid Outreach Coordinator and other staff are able to assist high school counselors in answering any questions that come up as their students complete their FAFSA in person at the event. This practice has been impacted because of the COVID-19 pandemic. It has become increasingly difficult to get in person events scheduled with our local schools. While some schools are scheduling online events, it has proven difficult to assist in the same one-on-one manner that our staff would have been able to in the past in person. Many of these events have not been scheduled by the high schools to the extent they were in previous years. We even have a few examples where the responsible person from the school did not show up to open the online meeting.

CCSF was hoping to start helping students in-person, which is instrumental in supporting our diverse group of students. On January 10, 2022, San Francisco County peaked with 6,803 new cases which delayed our return to campus plans.

CCSF's Financial Aid Office in collaboration with City DŔEĂM (Resource Center for Undocumented Student) has hosted several outreach events including virtual workshops, weekly text messages, emails and phone calls. Unfortunately, CCSF has not been able to host any in-person workshops or support. CCSF biggest in-person outreach event - Financial Aid Awareness Day also has been canceled due to safety precautions as a result of the COVID 19 outbreak. This is an annual event that would have hosted current and prospective students as well as people in the community to learn about their financial aid options. CCSF plans to start providing limited in-person services on February 28th. We are hoping this will help increase the number of students applying.

CCSF's CA Dream Act (CADAA) and FAFSA application numbers have drastically decreased from last year. Sadly, COVID positivity rates have had a negative effect on the attendance of our students and support staff. This limits the ability of our college and career services teams to ensure that all seniors have applied for FAFSA/Dream Act. Additionally, we have noticed the social-emotional health of students has left them feeling unwilling to move forward with college and career planning. Oddly, this year we have had a high rate of parental reluctance to release information about their access 2020 taxes to their children. Finally, our students seemed to be completely overwhelmed and are unable to find that school/home balance needed to confidently moe forward in preparing for their futures.

Due to limited staffing (because of COVID positivity rates and quarantine requirements) we were not able to even think of hosting a Cash for College event.

At the beginning of the week, we only had slightly over 40 percent of our students district-wide complete the FAFSA/Dream Act, even though about 70% of our students qualify for free/reduced lunch. The opportunity for senior students from the EI Monte Union High School District (EMUHSD) to submit either a FAFSA or CADAA financial aid application was greatly hindered by circumstances directly brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic. On-going complications attributed to COVID-19 including student attendance, staff availability, and safety protocols that have limited the availability of in-person, school-based financial aid workshops, have diminished our students' opportunities to complete and submit their FAFSA and CADAA applications by the March 2nd deadline.

The El Monte Union High School District scheduled six in-person Cash for College events to be held during the 2021/22 school year. The first of these events was held on October 21, 2021. Unfortunately we experienced relatively low attendance for this event due to what we believe was participant aversion to in-person meetings. The other five events were rescheduled to January and early February 2022. For safety reasons, we made the difficult decision to cancel these events, due to the increased spread of the Omicron variant during January.

According to the California Student Aid Commission's *Race to Submit* website, 61% of EMUHSD seniors from the class of 2021 submitted a FAFSA or CADAA application. As of February 20, 2022, the *Race to Submit* website shows that 37% of EMUHSD seniors have submitted a FAFSA or CADAA application. We currently have 24% fewer seniors that have submitted a FAFSA or CADAA application with less than two weeks to go before the established March 2nd deadline.

4. Additional comments (if any):

88% of EMUHSD students are socio-economically disadvantaged. Our students' living situation during the pandemic has often been compromised. From challenging living conditions to increased financial hardship, our families have struggled. I respectfully request that the California Student Aid Commission consider a 30 day deadline postponement of FAFSA and CADDA applications for EMUHSD students.

The COVID 19 pandemic has impacted students academically, socially, and emotionally. The continuous stress from this ongoing global health challenge has taken a toll on our students ability to focus not only on immediate needs, but also on longer term planning. Our senior students' stress and anxiety levels, as well as family angst, has impacted their post-high school planning which includes FAFSA/CADAA completion. Additionally, we have had an unprecedented number of students and staff continue to miss school due to either testing positive for COVID 19 or for needing to quarrantine. We have already had over 400 students on short term independent study this year, whereas in pre-pandemic times we had a school year average of 20. We also currently have double the number of students on long term independent study. This has impacted the Eureka High School support staff's ability to meet with students and parents in completing the FAFSA/CADAA by the March 2 deadline. Extending the FAFSA/CADAA application deadline will allow Eureka High School staff increased outreach capabilities, and give stressed students and families additional time to meet this important deadline.

To support FAFSA/CADAA completion, Eureka High School offered two Cash for College Workshops. The North Coast CalSOAP also offered workshops for Eureka students and had no attendees. Counselors presented to senior classes where they conducted FAFSA/CADAA completion workshops and offered individual application meetings to support application completion.
