Due to COVID-19, GGUSD counseling teams have had a difficult time reaching students and parents to complete the financial aid application. Despite numerous site based parent meetings both online and in person, there have been less families in attendance due to the surge in COVID cases from January 2022-February 2022 which impacted the ability for site counseling teams to make contact with students and families. Our GGUSD counselors routinely sent out Parent Square messages to remind senior parents the importance of completing the financial aid process, however there there is still a decline in the total number of submitted applications for the class of 2022.

Parent meetings are an important component in the FAFFSA/CA Dream Act application process. This year, GGUSD has offered a variety of meetings for parents at the school site, both via Zoom and in-person, to support the financial aid process and assist parents. Particularly in the past 3 months, participation by parents has been low due to the spike in COVID cases, family support, and work obligations. If granted the extension, counseling teams will continue efforts to reach out individually to seniors and families for students to complete the the application process.

In the 2021 school year, 2,536 of the 3,737 seniors (68%) submitted the FAFSA/CA Dream Act applications. As of February 28, 2022, 1,928 of the 3,458 current seniors (56%) have submitted their applications, which is a 12% drop in applications submitted compared to last year.

Garden Grove Unified School District school counselors will continue to support students in submitting the FAFSA/CA Dream Act application should this request be approved.

Challenges for our students include but are not limited to the following reasons: limited access to technology, technology challenges, etc. The Gavilan College district has continued its partnership with Cal-SOAP and local high school partners to provide workshops and presentations to increase FAFSA and CADAA completion.

Outreach efforts will continue throughout the aid year to help mitigate the differences. Additionally, the college offers in-person and virtual financial aid application assistance via our welcome center and financial aid counters. Even with the additional efforts, the lower numbers will have detrimental effects on our Cal Grant eligible students, as federal aid is often not sufficient to cover college costs. In addition, the deadline postponement will benefit students who have yet to submit their applications.

The spike led our schools to experience a shortage of school staff and impacted student attendance. As a result financial aid workshops had to be delayed.

We have not had cancellations or delays of our events but rather multiple absences due to COVID quarantiens.





Due to the on-going disruption to in person student services as a direct result of the COVID-19 pandemic, which is a declared National Emergency, students have had an adverse effect on their ability to submit the FAFSA and CADAA by the March 2 priority deadline. Outreach activities and our ability to host events to support the usual FAFSA/CADAA application process have been significantly impacted since March 2020. Latinx families have been disproportionately affected by this change. The number of applications from our region has decreased for the 2022-2023 academic year.

We were only able to hold one virtual Cash for College Workshop for our two high schools due to the pandemic.

Participation in the virtual workshops was significantly lower than in-person workshops, particularly with Latinx families.

Sonoma County high school students who have completed a FAFSA/CADAA by the March 2 deadline has seen a significant decrease. Nearly 43% of enrolled high school seniors completed a financial aid application in 2021, while only 27% of all enrolled high school seniors have completed the FAFSA/CADAA for 2022. The number of students receiving a Cal Grant award for 2022-23 is down by 43.8%. This is a clear indicator of the disproportionate impact the pandemic is having on our lowest income students who do not have the access to technology and resources.

Most of the outreach conducted this year has been virtual. Some of our current and prospective students have had challenges with network connections and accessing information resulting in a significant number of students unable to attend or miss the virtual information and tutorial sessions conducted. In addition to this, virtual learning has taken a toll on all students and has caused a lot of anxiety. Students have grown accustomed to large group workshops and face to face office visits where they can received one on one support. This has been very difficult due to COVID. In addition to our students facing challenges, the virtual environment that COVID forced all educational institutions into has brought challenges to all of our staff members. Contacting students and getting information to them in a timely manner has been a challenge in the new uncharted virtual world of COVID. We offered workshops Online, open virtual office hours and virtual office appointments to our students, however, the outcome has not been as successful in disseminating information to students compared to previous years.

Working with our local high schools has also been a challenge during this past year. New incoming freshmen are not accustomed to checking their emails daily and our inability to contact them has caused some prospective students to miss the deadline. HNU serves an extremely needy population and many of our incoming students usually have difficulties understanding the guidelines and regulations they are required to be met. Without proper personal guidance these prospective students face misunderstanding and confusion. The outcome of this lack of understanding has been a delay in submitting their application. It has also been brought to our attention that FAFSA and CADDA applications that have been submitted this year prior to the established deadline compared to last year's numbers has decreased. In light of these challenges faced by our students and staff during the Pandemic, we ask that the extension for our students get extended. Thank you for your consideration.

The FAFSA application is a complicated process for most students and their families and many families in our low income community struggle with the technology aspect of accessing the onlie and remote options available in place of in-person assistance due to continued gathering restrictions.

Traditionally Imperial Valley College holds in-person workshops at all local high schools as well as provides one-on-one assitance on campus at our financial aid computer lab. These options have not been available as they have in the past due to continued restrictions on in-person gatherings throughout this application season. It continues to be much more difficult to reach students and familes remotely for a variety of reasons.

Race to submit data continues to show up to 25% reduction in FAFSA applications compared to pre-pandemic figures and an average of 5% reduction from last year. We currently have noticably fewer seniors who have completed their financial aid applications. We believe this is directly due to the impact of the ongoing pandemic. Because of public health/safety mandates we have been required to hold most of our financial aid workshops via zoom, which creates limitations to access for students and especially for parents. Also, many of our current seniors--who were forced into distance learning for 13 months (or 15 months including summer school)-reported being underprepared and overwhelmed at the beginning of the year to make post-graduation decisions. They cited feeling underinformed of their options, of having missed out on informational activities that happen during the junior year, and of beng emotionally unprepared to make such an important decision for their future.

We had to schedule fewer financial aid workshops this year due to public safety concerns and less availability of staff beyond the school day-both in the district and from supporting agencies- to support these workshops. At events held during the school day, fewer students were prepared to work on their applications due to greater challenges in outreach to parents and the lost year of preparation work last year.

Every year, Kerman Unified, in collaboration with the Central Valley California Student Opportunity and Access Program (Cal-SOAP), works tirelessly to assist all our seniors with their post-secondary transition. Serving a large population of underrepresented students along with many first-generation students, it is of utmost importance that we serve our due diligence in meeting their needs in supporting them in accessing post-secondary education. This year has been adversely affected by the COVID-19 related school absences and protocols.

This year's workshops included various in-person sessions. Virtual sessions have also been offered and have become challenging because of faulty internet connection. As a result, some students experience many technical difficulties in trying to log on to virtual workshops hosted via Zoom. Also, our high school sites, Kerman High School, Enterprise High School, and Kerman Unified Online School hosted various in-person sessions with very little success since many of those students that were unable to attend stated that it was due health risk concerns and/or COVID-19 related school absences.

Over the last few years, we have seen a continually increasing trend in the number of FAFSA/CADAA application submissions. This year has been the exception. That is about a 27 percent difference from the 2020-2021 school year. As a firm believer of equity and access for all students, I ask for your consideration to granting an additional 30 calendar days beyond the March 2nd, 2021 deadline for students who were unable to submit their 2021-22 FAFSA or CADAA application due to disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

According to the Race To Submit website, all of the serving areas for Yosemite Community College District show a decrease in FAFSA/CADAA submissions. In 2021, Stanislaus County had a 42% submission rate; San Joaquin County 39%, Tuolumne County 30% and Calaveras County 49% sumbission rate. For the class of 2022 we see a decrease of FAFSA/CADAA submission that range between 7 to 21% decline. Districts such as Ceres Unified are showing a decline in FAFSA/CADAA submission from 2021 to 2022 of 17%; Modesto City Hihg are seeing a decline of 13%; and Riverbank Unified is experiencing a 33% decline in FAFSA/CADAA submissions. If we segregate the data by schools, the discrepancy among high

Second, students have experienced sickness or loss in their families that has impeded them from attending campus FAFSA workshops and promotions. Third, the COVID pandemic has created a sense of unpredictability and reliance on distance learning that has caused apprehension among students regarding their freshman year of college. This apprehension has caused senior students to delay their college planning process, including completing their FAFSA/CADAA applications.

A variety of events adversely effected the ability of students within MDUSD to successfully complete and submit their financial aid application by the established deadline. These included, that almost all of the Cash for College Workshops here because the intervence of the one-on-one help that occurs when we host these workshops in person. Many high schools chose to do a virtual presentation due to increase Covid cases in the county and because East Bay Consortium, (the folks who partner with CSAC to host Cash for College Workshops) did not have their volunteers available for -person events because of COVID

Fewer families attended the in-person workshops than what is typical, possibly due to the rise in COVID cases throughout the winter months. CHS's Cash for College presentation in November was attended by a decent amount of families, but we were only able to help 25-30 families after the presentation. The Omicron surge during January 2022 greatly impacted Oakland Unified School District's ability to support seniors in financial aid applications. In <u>Alameda County</u>, the omicron surge peaked on January 10th, with 14,141 new cases and a daily average of 3,037. The 7-day average during the week of January 16th was 4,537.

The rapid rise in cases caused a significant increase in both student and staff absences throughout January. For the first semester of the 2021-2022 school year, senior students were absent districtwide at a rate of 16.6%. During the month of January, senior students were absent at a rate of 33.4%.

In addition to student absences, the surge caused a great deal of teacher absences. During the first week after the winter break (January 4-7), 62 teachers were absent, representing 8.6% of the total instructional staff at the high school level. Additionally, many of our high schools had extensive teacher "sick outs" to draw attention to gaps in the district's COVID response plan. With so many students absent, and so many staff out or covering for their sick, quarantined, or protesting colleagues, our internal ability to support financial aid applications was severely hampered.

In addition to the interruption of financial aid support services caused by staff and student absences, student services were further disrupted by the fact that our community based partners withdrew their staff from inperson services during the month of January. Oakland Unified relies on outside contractors for much of our financial aid support, and their physical absence from campuses, paired with general OUSD staff and student absences, meant most services planned for the month of January were effectively halted.

Specifically:

- **Destination College Advising Corps and the Early Academic Outreach Program** (serving 646 seniors) were remote-only until January 31st. Advisers were limited to 1:1 in-person services through the first week of February, limiting classroom presentations and in-person Cash for College events for our students.
- East Bay Solano County Consortium (serving 367 seniors) was also remote-only through January 18th. They saw attrition in their college-aged advisors, many of whom did not return after the break, leaving our campuses short-staffed.
- Other community based organizations that suspended in person programming for some or all of January include: TRiO, Upward Bound, Educational Talent Search, and Oakland Promise.

Because of the instability in our schools and the lack of availability from our partners, we were unable to host planned events in January. Many of these events were pushed back to the first week of February. This caused further confusion and delay when applications submitted on February 3rd-February 8th were not uploaded into our CSAC data, despite students receiving individual confirmation emails. We have needed to devote time that would normally be spent on direct student services to tracking applications that were submitted but not counted and determining next steps. March 9, 2022

The Omicron surge delayed or canceled the majority of our services districtwide during the month of January. This includes:

- **Larger events**, such as the Cash for College planned at Skyline High School and Oakland High School for late January. Districtwide, all large events that promoted outreach to students and their families had to be canceled.
- **Classroom Push-Ins** at a districtwide level because of the lack of staff and teachers, as well as pervasive student absences. This was compounded by the fact that many partners did not allow their staff to participate in advising beyond 1:1 or small groups, even once they returned to campuses in person.
- **1:1 Services** at a districtwide level because of lack of staff, student absenteeism, and remote-only partners and staff. Typically, our most vulnerable students struggle to access virtual assistance opportunities, putting them at a particular disadvantage during the month of January.

Staff Education and Outreach for Financial Aid Support due to the high number of teacher absences. This hampered our ability to provide staff education on the importance of financial aid submission, thereby weakening our messaging about financial aid to students and families.

The disruptions caused by Omicron have impacted our ability to support students in completing their financial aid applications by March 2nd. Even in comparison to last year, when numbers statewide were historically low, Oakland Unified School District is about 2% behind our previous year's rate as of February 16th. The instability caused by Omicron has meant that we have briefly needed to pivot from in-person to virtual services without adequate time to plan, or to ensure that our students have the materials to access virtual advising, including reliable technology and wifi. This disadvantages our most vulnerable students, and we are deeply concerned about the rate of on-time applications projected for our African American, Latinx, and low-income students specifically.

4. Additional comments (if any):

As the surge decreases, Oakland Unified has redoubled its efforts to reach out to students, families, and staff to support financial aid applications. Currently, sites are supporting students to apply using a variety of outreach methods, including classroom presentations, schoolwide events, phone banking, home visits, and 1:1 advising appointments. If provided this extension, we are confident that we can make up the ground that was lost in January and support many more of our students to submit applications for aid.

Due to the ongoing COVID 19 pandemic, our school district returned to in person learning after a year and a half of distance learning. The pandemic has disproportionately impacted low-income communities, including our PVUSD community. Consequently, our students and families have been actively experiencing food insecurity and financial hardships. Return to in person school was challenging due to the social emotional distress experienced by students, families, and district personnel. Given the high exposure rate, many planned FAFSA/CADAA events were converted to a virtual setting and application numbers declined.

85% of in-person financial aid assistance events were canceled. Although, PVUSD still held seven virtual events attendance dropped from an average of 300 families in the 2019-2020 academic year to 185 in 2020-2021 to 162 families in 2021-2022 academic year. Since the majority of our students are first generation college students there is a high need for individual support with the application. The financial hardships and insecurities students are facing at home are delaying their decision to purse post-secondary education. Giving our students more time to complete applications would greatly benefit our community.

We went from two in-person workshops to hosting only one in a much less functional space. We held a second event online, but turn-out for online events like that were much lower than the inperson workshops, particularly with Latinx families. Turn-out for the in-person workshop was much lower than normal likely due to concerns about health and safety.

aid application from the previous year. Petaluma Joint Union high school students who have completed a FAFSA/CADAA by the March 2 deadline has seen a significant decrease. Nearly 52% of enrolled high school seniors completed a financial aid application in 2021, while only 38% of all enrolled high school seniors have completed the FAFSA/CADAA for 2022. The number of students completing a Cal Grant application award for 2022-23 is 38%, down from 50% in 2021. There has been greater than a 32% reduction in the number of Cal Grants awarded to Petaluma Joint Union School District seniors from 2021/2022 to 2022/2023. This is a clear indicator of the disproportionate impact the pandemic is having on our lowest income students who do not have as much access to technology and resources.
