The COVID-19 pandemic has affected students' ability to apply for financial aid. Both in-person and virtual opportunities for students to gain assistance with their application are at a greater need, and while more virtual opportunities are occuring, most students and parents do not attend those opportunities. In-person events have not been held in nearly two years as most colleges who have visited campuses to help students with their applications have moved to online only instruction or limited in-person support for students. The limited support to help students apply has seen the effect of the number of applications being completed/submitted.

Due to the pandemic, outreach from feeder colleges to host traditional in-person Cash for College events to support students and families with financial aid has not occured. There has been a decrease in students attending virtual and in-person financial aid events or workshops to help assist them with their application.

3. If available, provide data showing that there has been, or is likely to be, a reduction in the number of students who have completed a financial aid application from the previous year.

Only 42.59% have submitted applications from our current senior class versus 67.59% who submitted last school year. The pandemic has affected not only students' ability to submit their application on time, but now in year 2, more students are not seeing college as an option. If additional time is granted, this would help alleviate the pressure to submit the application by the deadline and allow a greater number of students to complete/ submit their Financial Aid application.

4. Additional comments (if any):

Many, if not, most students at our school are first generation college bound, and do not have the support from home to apply for financial aid. Most seniors who are eligible for financial aid are seeing and feeling the effects of the pandemic on their family's financial situations and have reconsidered the opportunity to seek out higher education due to rising living costs. The ability to see that money is available to help them enter college without a huge financial burden may help them reconsider the pursuit of college. We hope you can honor our request for an exemption.

The coronavirus pandemic and school closures/restrictions has had an adverse effect on students' ability to submit their financial aid application by the March 2nd deadline. Due to school restrictions, students are unable to meet face to face with Financial aid support staff to receive FAFSA/CADAA application assistance or questions. Most workshops are via zoom. Students have experienced a financial crisis due to loss of employment and income. As a result, students are suffering from depression and anxiety and need support. Low income students without internet access fall in the widening digital gap and lack access to complete the application. Access to the kind of one-on-one assistance by financial aid professionals on college campuses is key to getting more students to submit the application, enroll in colleges and receive more financial aid.

90% of workshops are still held via zoom. Face to Face workshops were converted in the winter due to the omnicron uptake in our region. Although attendance via zoom has increased over last year, it is no where near meeting the needs of students and their families.

Data from FAFSA Volume Report by Federal Student Aid shows the FAFSA Completion number by college, by year: 20-21 Year as compared to 21-22 to date: Norco down 19%, Moreno Valley down 16%, Riverside City down 13%

Outreach activities served 96% less students on a 1V1 bassis for the 22-23 application cycle. Most workshops were offered via zoom or converted to zoom during the winter.

In order to ensure equity in students ability to apply for and receive a Cal Grant award, this deadline needs to be extended for all students across the board. This continues to be a struggling time for students and we are still seeing federal waivers and allowances due to current circumstances. The State needs to provide the same student centered allowances for their student populations.

The covid-19 pandemic that has impacted every community across the state has brought on additional barriers for our Rowland community, including access to resources and support in completing the application, reduced opportunities to engage in activities at the school that would support the application process, family circumstances that draw attention and priorities away from completing the application (i.e. health, employment, housing). The pandemic continues to limit engagement and participation in school activities, which in turn limits knowledge and awareness, access to resources and support, and ability to actively participate.

While financial aid outreach events have not been canceled, in-person events have been extremely limited. Our district continues to limit visitors to campus as measures of safety for students and staff. Events to support families with financial aid continue to be offered virtually. However, many of our Rowland families have had a much more difficult time in attending and participating in general. Some families have limited understanding and use of technology that limits their participation in virtual events. In addition, quarantining from either a covid infection or from having been exposed and/or around others who have been infected with covid, students and families have missed multiple days from school. This impacts access to resources, events, and support.

Districtwide our schools were closed for in-person instruction from 3/13/2020 through the end of the 2020-2021 school year as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Though our students returned in person to school on 8/2/2021, the pandemic continued to add significant barriers for students and families applying for financial aid. Our educators did their best to serve students who were exhausted emotionally, strained economically, impaired by the physical and mental health hardships of the time, and playing catch-up both in their social-emotional and academic learning after nearly a year and a half working remotely. Many familities relocated during the pandemic, making it more difficult to find documents needed to accurately apply for financial aid, especially when familities were struggling with imminent needs. COVID exposures, illness and bereavement have caused attendance rates to suffer, meaning students have been at school less often to learn about completing their FAFSA/CADAA, More students than normal have picked up extra jobs to help support their families, leaving them less time to work on applications and less available to stay after school for help applying.

Many of our schools' planned FAFSA/CADAA and Cash for College workshops had to move to a virtual modality. While we are proud of our counselors and college & career readiness teachers' hard work scheduling and publicizing these virtual events, it is our observation that at virtual workshops there is a decreased level of trust and engagement with students and parents applying for financial aid. COVID infections required some of our schools' in-person financial aid events to limit the number of attendees and/or move outdoors, which decreased the number of students and families who participated, During the COVID-19 school closures of 2020-21, our district's chronic absenteeism rate spiked to nearly 25%, and so far in 2021-22 we have seen sites suffer chronic absenteeism of well over 30% which meant even fewer students engaged and decreased access for educators to offer support on financial aid applications.

In pre-pandemic 2020, 51% of our San Bernardino City USD 12th graders (1798 of 3482 enrolled) submitted a FAFSA or CADAA. In 2021 during school closure, only 42% (1482 of 3490 enrolled) submitted, representing more than a 17% decrease in submission rate from 2020 to 2021. In response to this drop, our district intensified our support of school counselors and college and career readiness teachers with data tools, frequent monitoring and communication around financial aid applications. Our efforts have managed to nearly close the gap between district FAFSA/CADAA submission rates and those of the county and state. Even so, as of 2/24/2022, only 35% of SBCUSD seniors (1245 of 3490 enrolled) had submitted financial aid applications according to the 2022-23 Race to Submit Dashboard, a submission rate closer to that of our county and state than in 2021, but over 31% lower than our pre-pandemic rate.

We continue to improve our district-wide systems to ensure all students have support completing the FAFSA/CADAA application process, and more intently than ever as we anticipate AB469 and the systemic boost to financial aid applications we believe it will inspire. Should this deadline postponement request be granted, we have a robust plan to reach and support students through April 1, including sharing of information with students by email, mass notification and flyers. We will be creating large-group and one-to-one support opportunities for students who need help completing financial aid applications during our March 21-April 1spring break. The continued impact of the Covid-19 pandemic has resulted in increased absenteeism for students and school staff. Due to teacher shortages, emergency class coverages (by school counselors and other staff) have become commonplace and thereby has resulted in a reduction of support to students in need of financial aid assistance. Hardships brought on by the pandemic continue to endure and burden our students with a myriad of stressors leading to mental health issues (depression/anxiety) and consequentially, a disconnect from school. Some students must work to help their families financially and are limited in the amount of time they can spend completing their financial aid applications.

From October 2021 (Fall) through January 2022 (Spring), 15 Cash for College events were offered to students. Of the 15 events, 4 events were held fully in-person, 2 were hybrid and the remaining 9 were held virtually. Many of our students and families, especially those that have been historically marginalized may not have access to technology as we witnessed last year in distance learning. The limited availability of in-person financial aid events presents a huge barrier to equitable access of support for the financial aid process. Without assistance to navigate this process, there will be many students who give up or check out.

The class of 2019 FASFA/CADAA completion rate was 81%. The class of 2020 FASFA/CADAA completion rate was 76% (in-person school closed on March 17, 2020). The class of 2021 FASFA/CADAA completion rate was 76%. We believe that the extension we received last school year was instrumental in keeping our rate steady from 2020 to 2021. Currently, for the 2022 school year we are only at 54% and the March 2 deadline is quickly approaching. We feel strongly that an extension would greatly benefit many students who are in need of financial aid and who are currently interested but behind in the process.

Having an additional 30 days would help many students who have been struggling with the impacts of the pandemic to successfully complete this process and set them on course for college.

We had a Cash for College Night and due to COVID-19 spikes the number of parents who attended was low.

All of our high schools in SJUSD have had a decrease this year in completion of the financial aid application. Due to Covid-19 our San Rafael City Schools seniors have low completion rates on their financial aid applications. Our students are focused on catching up on school work as they re-adjust to in person learning. Most of our seniors work afterschool to support their families financially. We have offered workshops during and after school, both in person and virtually, but our students have little time between classes and work. Our student populations are at high risk and is in our counties epicenter of covid cases. Additionally, with lack of computers at home, reliable technology/wifi, or time due to work schedules, we experienced drastically low parent turnout rate and participation during our financial aid workshops, especially among our Spanish-Speaking parents. We are actively working with students one-on-one and have financial aid workshops coming up to continue efforts to increase our completition rates. The 30 day extension period would greatly benefit the students in our district and allow us to continue these efforts.

The schools within our district have held workshops and one-on-one meetings since October. At the beginning of the school year and now students are more focused on catching up with school and being able to graduate. Our school staff were also very busy gearing up for reentry and dealing with a lot of covid-19 cases and a lot of students missing class. Many of our students have also been absent for weeks at a time because of testing positive, which also becomes a barrier for students to attend in-person workshops and events and most of our students are still not proficient on using Zoom or a laptop. Moreover, financial aid nights, workshops and presentations for parents were moved to all virtual meetings, which had drastically lower turnouts than in previous years. Participation among Spanish-Speaking families and students was extremely low due to lack of these in-person events.

Overall, California is experiencing an 18% decrease in financial aid completion rates and our schools are not an exception. We are currently at 60% and working hard to reach or surpass our 96% completion rate of last year.

This postponement will allow for the counseling teams in our schools to reach out to the students who have yet to complete their applications. We have a large population of low-income, Spanish-Speaking, first-generation, underserved students and parents who would greatly benefit from the financial support that these applications offer. With this additional time, we can reach these families.

Covid-19 Pandemic has adversely impacted the students' and their families' ability to meet the March 2 financial aid program deadline. We have seen the following effects in comparison to prior years:

- Significant drops in financial aid application submissions
- Difficulties in reaching high school students in remote learning environments Students and families quarantining due to positive results, limiting them to meet in-person or virtually
- Inability to host annual cash for college events with limited resources and remote operations
- Submission system delays with the review process, especially when submitting supporting documentation for unemployment or death of parent/caregiver

- The following events have been scheduled to support our families with financial aid:

Please approve the deadline postponement of the 2022-2023 FAFSA and CADAA applications for Santa Barbara Unified School District students from March 2, 2022, to April 1, 2022. Per your communication on February 17, 2022, the California Student Aid Commission may grant an additional 30 calendar days beyond the March 2, 2022 deadline for students who were unable to submit their 2021-22 FAFSA or CADAA application due to disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic as defined in Section 69513.2.(d).

COVID-19 continues to harm our student's ability to submit their financial aid applications by the established deadline. With the second COVID19 surge of the Omicron variant, we have observed a significant increase in student absences between December through February, sometimes with up to 25% of our student population unable to attend school in person. The Omicron surge also impacted staff attendance. Many of our Counselors, support staff, and community partners who engage in Financial Aid efforts were not as readily available to host or assist in Financial Aid Workshops and classroom visits as initially planned.

Our district uses our College and Career Counselors and School Counseling staff to conduct presentations on Financial Aid in our Economics and Government classes. From these presentations, we promote additional Financial Aid workshops facilitated by our team and the Cash-to-College Workshops hosted by the CA Student Aid Commission. School sites host the Workshops during the day. We offer Workshops at community centres and school sites in the evening in both English and Spanish to support parents and families who have questions about applying for Financial Aid. We also use the class time to identify students who may need additional support and sign them up for workshops directly.

However, since our high schools are all currently on a block schedule in response to the pandemic, about half of our seniors would have Economics and Government in the Fall, and about half of our seniors have Economics and Government in the Spring. With the Omicron surge, the increased absences of our students and staff, along with the shortage of substitutes, meant that many of these Spring classroom presentations were not completed. We estimate, therefore, that approximately half of our senior class (approximately 800 students) did not have dedicated class time to learn about Financial Aid. Not only has this impacted student awareness of the Financial Aid workshops and deadlines, but it has also limited our ability to connect with students during class time and proactively provide additional support. When we attempt to call students into the Counseling centre for assistance in person, the students have often been physically absent from school. We are promoting our

Workshops using weekly school announcements, Counseling newsletters, and school site social media posts, but we have found that attendance at the Workshops is less than in prior years. Additionally, using the resources on the CSAC Webgrants page, we can see that the number of students to date this year who have successfully completed a Financial Aid application is less than the same date in prior years, particularly prior to COVID. (Ex. We have had 900 fewer applications submitted so far in 2021-2022, when compared to 2019-2020).

While we are still collecting data on the number of students in our district who have successfully completed FAFSA or CADAA applications for 2022-2023, we know from a letter sent on February 17, 2022, by Tony Thurmond, CA Superintendent of Public Education, that CA is experiencing a significant decrease in FAFSA forms completed when compared to prior years. We anticipate similar numbers in our district.

We ask the Commission to please deem all Santa Barbara Unified students who file a FAFSA or CADAA between March 2, 2022, and April 1, 2022, as on-time applications. Thank you for your consideration.

SRCS also works closely with 10K Degrees, a local non-profit. 10K Degrees provided a "Train the Trainer" professional development session for counselors and also collaborated with our staff to offer workshops that students and families could attend to get support with completing their FAFSA/CADAA. In addition to working closely with community and postsecondary partners, the SRCS College and Career Counselors did presentations in senior classes about the FAFSA and CADAA, as well as workshops and one-on-one application completion support in the College and Career Centers

Our continuation and independent study schools had a FAFSA completion rate of 39.1% in 2021 and currently for the class of 2022 they have a completion rate of 23.6% (25/106)

Our change in the number of FAFSA completers for the class of 2022 is 23.7% lower than the class of 2021. This drop is greater than the state average for 2022 by over 10%.

Our district is very rural and serves communities spread over 773 square miles, many in remote mountainous regions. The roads connecting these communities can be treacherous at best and impassable in inclement weather, which we experienced often this year. Buses could not run to bring students to school and parents/guardians were not able to transport their students or themselves to school to receive help from professionals to fill out the FAFSA. In addition, because of our rural location, many families have very spotty and unreliable internet service to seek assistance online.





Although Windsor students have been back on campus this year, the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic (a declared national Emergency) has hampered our staff's ability to do outreach to seniors regarding the completion of their financial aid applications. Also, Windsor High School did not conduct any in person Cash for College workshops this year, which are a normal part of our financial aid support to our families. Our Latinx families, which make up over 39% of our student population, have been disproportionately affected by the pandemic and the reduced services.

2. Provide a list of any financial aid outreach events, including, but not necessarily limited to, workshops or webinars sponsored by the commission, that have been canceled or delayed due to the qualifying event.

In previous years, Windsor High has worked with our local community college campus and with a community based organization to offer hands on workshops, especially for our Spanish speaking families. This year we have had fewer workshops, and the Spanish sessions have only be virtual which resulted in very low participation rates.

- 3. If available, provide data showing that there has been, or is likely to be, a reduction in the number of students who have completed a financial aid application from the previous year.
- In 2019: 3 in person Cash for College workshops were attended by 103 families.
- In 2020: 2 virtual Cash for College workshops resulted in only 31 families participating.
- In 2021: 2 virtual Cash for College workshops resulted in only 48 families participating.

Our FAFSA/CADAAs submited as of March 1, 2022 is 155 applications, 21 fewer than for 2021.

Windsor High would appreciate the additional time this postponement would give us to encourage more seniors to complete their FAFSA/CADAA applications.
