SPONSORED & SUPPORTED LEGISLATION

AB 1746 (Medina) - Cal Grant Reform Act

Summary: Enacts the Cal Grant Reform Act, which would revise and recast the provisions establishing and governing the existing Cal Grant programs. The bill would authorize the Commission to adopt emergency regulations to implement the Cal Grant Reform Act. The new Cal Grant Program would include a Cal Grant 2 Program and a Cal Grant 4 Program, with specified eligibility requirements. This bill is contingent on an appropriation.

Status: Assembly Higher Education

Position: Sponsor

Alignment with Policy Priorities: Maximize equitable public investment in California students through financial aid. Maximize the effectiveness of state financial aid programs.

AB 2004 (Cristina Garcia) - California DREAM Loan Program

Summary: Increases the total amount of DREAM loan funding that California Dream Act Application students can borrow to a total of \$40,000 in a lifetime. The most current bill fact sheet states the intent of the author to add provisions that would establish terms of discharging debt that mirror the federal programs and require the UC and CSU to provide additional reporting requirements to the legislature.

Alignment with Policy Priorities: Maximize the effectiveness of state financial aid programs (Ensure undocumented students – who are unable to access federal financial aid – have access to financial aid opportunities comparable to their peers).

AB 2286 (Irwin) - Student Aid Commission: donations and philanthropic funds

Summary: Authorizes CSAC to receive and direct the use of philanthropic funding.

AB 2810 (Arambula) - Institutional FAFSA data for CalFresh outreach

Summary: States the intent to codify the <u>U.S. DOE's Dear Colleague Letter GEN-22-02</u> issued on January 20, 2022. Additionally, this bill would require each CSU campus and each community college district to use FAFSA data to identify students who meet the income qualifications for CalFresh, and send an email informing the student that they may qualify for the CalFresh program if the student can also meet one of the exemptions for the CalFresh student eligibility rules.

It would also conform a definition of "half-time" student to the federal definition, for the purposes of determining CalFresh eligibility.

SB 20 (Dodd) - Notification to CalFresh eligible students

Summary: Would require CSAC to notify students that they may be eligible for CalFresh benefits under other exemptions other than TANF-funded CalGrant. This bill would also require the California Community College Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) to create a form that can be used by students and administrators to verify that a student qualifies for an exemption from the CalFresh student rule.

SB 641 (Skinner) - CalFresh for College Students Act

Summary: Would require the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) to post on its website a list of programs that meet the employment & training exemption for CalFresh as well as instructions for county human service workers regarding processing applications, reporting, and recertification for additional students who are exempt from the CalFresh student eligibility rule. This bill would also require CDSS to convene a workgroup (CSAC included) to identify the steps necessary to establish a CalFresh application submission process that improves access to real-time information about applications submitted and accommodates the large influx of CalFresh applications during the beginning of a school term.

Alignment with Policy Priorities: Advance efforts that help students access other forms of assistance to cover non-tuition expenses (e.g., CalFresh, housing assistance, affordable student lending options, etc.).

SB 1141 (Limon) - AB 540 eligibility criteria modification

Summary: Would reduce, for purposes of AB 540 eligibility, the total years of full-time attendance in certain California schools, the years of full-time high school coursework in California, and the total years of attendance in California elementary schools and California secondary schools required from 3+ years to 2+ years.

Alignment with Policy Priorities: Ensure undocumented students – who are unable to access federal financial aid – have access to financial aid opportunities comparable to their peers.

LEGISLATION WITH DIRECT IMPACT TO THE COMMISSION

AB 1290 (Lee) – Student Aid Commission student membership

Summary: Adds new seats to the Student Aid Commission to include four student members, one from each of the following: University of California (UC), California State University (CSU), California Community Colleges (CCC), and a California private postsecondary educational institution.

<u>AB 1633 (Seyarto) - Public postsecondary education: veterans' educational benefits: information sharing</u>

Summary: Requires the CSU, starting with the 2023-24 academic year, to electronically transmit to the Department of Veteran Affairs specific personal information regarding each student whose tuition/fees are paid (or are intended to be paid) using GI Bill educational benefits. It would also require, on or before June 1, 2023, that CSAC develop a template for a written consent that permits a student to opt in to having the student's person information shared with the Department of Veteran Affairs.

AB 2222 (Reyes) - Golden State Social Opportunities Program

Summary: Establishes the Golden State Social Opportunities Program for CSAC to administer grants (up to \$20,000) to students enrolled in an in-state postgraduate program and who commit to working in a California-based nonprofit eligible setting for their required post degree hours of supervised experience.

AB 2263 (Villapudua) - Golden State Apprenticeship and Vocational Training Emergency Assistance Grant Program

Summary: Establishes the Golden State Apprenticeship and Vocational Training Emergency Assistance Grant Program for CSAC to administer and provide one-time grants (between \$1,000-\$3,000) to California residents in financial need, as determined by the commission, who meet certain requirements for purposes of paying educational-related expenses associated with the eligible recipient's state-approved apprenticeship or vocational program of participation.

AB 2437 (Boerner Horvath) - California Pay Our Interns Program

Summary: Establishes the California Pay Our Interns Program to be administered by CSAC to provide stipends to eligible recipients participating in unpaid internships at offices of the Legislature, Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or any state agency/department.

AB 2489 (Salas) - Neighborhood Teacher Incentive Grant Program

Summary: Establishes the Neighborhood Teacher Incentive Grant Program for CSAC to administer and provide grants to local educational agencies for the purpose of providing awards to teachers who agree to reside within the attendance boundaries of a priority school in which they are assigned to teach for at least five years.

AB 2572 (Blanca Rubio) - CSAC Spot Bill

Summary: Currently a spot bill related to the provision about the commission's structure.

AB 2652 (McCarty) - CalFresh Spot Bill

Summary: The author's office has expressed their intent to amend this spot bill and include the following three CSAC CalFresh work group recommendations:

- Establish the regional hub pilot program
- Establish the pilot food benefit program for CADAA filers
- Direct colleges/universities to require local campus food service venues to accept CalFresh EBT cards

AB 2880 (Bonta) - College Access Tax Credit operative date extension

Summary: Extends the sunset date of the College Access Tax Credit (CATC) from 2023 to 2028.

SB 419 (Stern) - Californians for All College Service Program

Summary: Establishes the Californians for All College Service Program, under the administration of CSAC, which would award annual grants to eligible students to finance tuition and fees not covered by federal, state, or institutionally administered grants or fee waivers commencing with the 2024–25 academic year.

SB 851 (Portantino) - Cal Grant Program: independent institutions of higher education

Summary: Establishes the maximum tuition award amount at the same maximum tuition award amount for new Cal Grant recipients at private non-profit institutions from the prior year the same maximum tuition, adjusted by an amount equal to the CA Consumer Price Index. This bill would also allow a California Community College Expanded Entitlement Award recipient to transfer to an independent institution of higher education and remain eligible to receive the award. Additionally, the bill extends the Students with Dependent Children (SWDC) and the Foster Youth access awards to students attending an private non-profit institution of higher education.

SB 1341 (Cortese) - Basic Income Pilot Program Spot Bill

Summary: Currently a spot bill related to CalFresh. However, the author's office has expressed interest in turning this spot bill into a guaranteed basic income pilot program to address summer melt that CSAC would administer.

OTHER TRACKED PRIORITY BILLS

AB 288 (Calderon) - California Ban on Scholarship Displacement Act of 2021

Summary: Enacts the California Ban on Scholarship Displacement Act, which would prohibit each public and private institution of higher education in the state that receives, or benefits from, state-funded financial assistance, or that enrolls students who receive statefunded student financial assistance, from reducing certain students' institution-based financial aid offer below their financial need.

AB 1606 (Irwin) - Public postsecondary education: veterans: waiver of mandatory systemwide tuition and fees

Summary: Adds children, spouses, and unmarried surviving spouses of any veteran of the United States military who has a service-connected disability, has been killed in service, or has died of a service-connected disability, where their annual income does not exceed the national poverty line, as eligible groups to have their tuition and fees waived at the UC, CSU, and California Community Colleges.

AB 1671 (Patterson) - California Ban on Scholarship Displacement for Foster Youth Act of 2022

Summary: Enacts the California Ban on Scholarship Displacement for Foster Youth Act of 2022, which would prohibit each public and private institution of higher education in the state that receives, or benefits from, state-funded financial assistance, or that enrolls students who receive state-funded student financial assistance, from reducing an institution-based financial aid award below the financial need of a student who is a current or former foster youth, a resident of California, and enrolled in an institution of higher education to obtain an undergraduate degree.

AB 1764 (Medina) - Public postsecondary education student housing survey

Summary: Requires the CSU Office of the Chancellor, California Community College Chancellors Office, and the Office of the President of the University of California to collect specified data on student housing insecurity at each of their respective campuses. This bill also requires each segment to submit a report on the collected student housing insecurity data to the Legislature and the Legislative Analyst's Office on or before each October 15 of years 2023, 2025, and 2027.

AB 1998 (Smith) - California Community Colleges: nonresident tuition fees Spot Bill

Summary: Express the intent to enact legislation to address nonresident tuition fees at California community colleges.

AB 2266 (Santiago) - Community colleges: California College Promise: fee waiver eligibility

Summary: Expands the California College Promise (CCP) program to provide two years of tuition free community college to all full-time students, whether they are first-time or returning students.

AB 2371 (Santiago) - Public postsecondary education: California State University: tuition

Summary: Prohibits the charging of tuition/mandatory systemwide fees at a CSU campus for any academic year, for up to 2 academic years, to students that meet the following criteria: are California Community College resident transfers, have completed an associate degree for transfer (ADT), and received a fee waiver. Students who qualify to have their tuition/fees waived through this program, have financial need, and have all or a portion of their tuition and fees waived by other financial aid programs would receive a grant in the amount of tuition and fees that would have otherwise been waived to help cover their nontuition costs.

AB 2491 (Cervantes) - CalFresh Spot Bill

Summary: States the intent to enact legislation that will reduce the barriers college students face when accessing CalFresh benefits.
