Dear Deputy Director Kang:

As the President of the California Jazz Conservatory, I am respectfully submitting an appeal to the Commission's decision to discontinue our participation in the 2022-2023 academic year Cal Grant program.

Founded in 2009, the California Jazz Conservatory (CJC) is the only independent, accredited music conservatory in the country devoted solely to the study and performance of the African American art form, jazz, and related styles of music. The California Jazz Conservatory is a small private, non-profit institution that annually has a FTFT cohort size of fewer than 20 students.

The disqualification of the Cal Grant program was determined by the certification of California Education Code Section 69432.7(I)(3) that reported the graduation rate of less than 30% for our 2014 first-time, full-time (FTFT) cohort. The data reported to the USDE, IPEDS report, calculates the cohort graduation rate of 0%. This is not an accurate representation of the overall institutional performance.

When calculating the total number of students enrolled fall 2014, based on the overall institutional performance, the graduation rate is 43%. The chart below was calculated and verified by our Dean of Administration.

The fall 2014 cohort of FTFT students includes 3 starts. The overall population for fall 2014 cohort was 68 students.

¹ 2020 IPEDS Graduation Rate Data Summary

The IPEDS, FTFT cohort of 3 students has a 6-year graduation rate of 0%. When based on our overall institutional performance, the fall 2014 cohort includes the enrollment of 68 students. Within the 150% (6-year) graduation requirement, 29 of those students graduated. The graduation rate is 43%.

We are confident that future reviews of our graduation rate, calculated by the overall institutional performance, will remain over 30% as in our last two consecutive academic years, 11 students graduated. As documentation, the BPPE School Performance Fact Sheet for the years of 2016 and 2017 lists student completion within 150% of the published programs length at 50% and above. (The BPPE School Performance Fact Sheet is included in our attached supporting documentation.)

Our initial Cal Grant IPA was approved, September 23, 2021. The academic year of 2022-2023 will launch the beginning for CJC to recruit students who have been awarded from the Cal Grant entitlement program. Offering the Cal Grant award would allow the continued recruitment of first-generation students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, residing in Alameda County. Many talented high school students have historically declined our acceptance due to their family's inability to meet the financial gap. Upon approval of our appeal, CJC may offer a financially secure degree program through the combination of Federal and State awards in addition to institutional scholarships based on need and merit. As a private, non-profit institution, our tuition cost is moderate. Reported on the CSAC 2021-22 College Cost Estimate form lists the annual tuition of \$21,800. (As reference the CSAC G-33 form is included in our attached supporting documentation.)

Based on the information above and the attached supporting documentation I hope that the Commission will reconsider the ineligible status for the 2022-2023 participation of the Cal Grant program by based on our 43% graduation rate of overall institutional performance. 

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Definitions

- "Number of Students Who Began the Program" means the number of students who began a
 program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program
 length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the
 cancellation period.
- "Students Available for Graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- "Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- "150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "Graduates Available for Employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- "Graduates Unavailable for Employment" means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become
 incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United
 States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their
 education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- "Graduates Employed in the Field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- "Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

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Cancellation Policy

The student has the right to cancel the **STUDENT ENROLLMENT AGREEMENT** and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. A notice of cancellation shall be in writing and submitted to the Registrar. The notice to cancel the Enrollment Agreement will be considered effective no later than the date it is received by the Registrar. Please submit the notice of cancellation to: California Jazz Conservatory, 2087 Addison Street, Berkeley, California 94704.

Refunds for students who cancel the Enrollment Agreement within the aforementioned timeframe may obtain a 100% refund of charges paid less the Registration Fee (\$50) and Enrollment Deposit (\$200).

Refunds for students who withdraw during a period of attendance are calculated as follows: Students who have completed 60 percent or less of the period of attendance shall receive a refund calculated on a pro-rata basis. Refunds shall be calculated based on the total amount owed by the student for the portion of the educational program completed as of the date of receipt of the notice of cancellation or withdrawal. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of monies not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.

Please note: A pro-rata refund shall be no less than the total amount owed by the student for the portion of the educational program provided subtracted from the amount paid by the student, calculated as follows: The amount owed equals the daily charge for the program (total institutional charge, divided by the number of days or hours in the program), multiplied by the number of days student attended, or was scheduled to attend, prior to withdrawal.

A student is not eligible for a refund who has been enrolled for more than 60 percent of the term.

The California Jazz Conservatory shall issue or credit refunds within 45 calendar days of a student's cancellation, withdrawal or completion of the program.

Upon a student's failure to pay a debt owed to the California Jazz Conservatory, permission to register for the forthcoming semester may be withheld. The California Jazz Conservatory also reserves the right to withhold a student's transcript until the debt and all costs associated with collecting it are paid in full.
