

#### **2022-2023 State Budget &**

#### **Cal Grant Reform**



2022-23 State Budget

**Adopts the Cal Grant Equity Framework** 

beginning in the 2024-25 academic year



A "revenue trigger" in May 2024 will confirm if there is sufficient funding on a multiyear basis is available to support this expansion Current Projections Indicate Sufficient Revenue



\$500K to Begin Implementation Work Now and adapt systems to reflect the Cal Grant Equity Framework

### The Cal Grant Equity Framework

Redesigned programs structured around student needs

- Cal Grant 2 for Community College Students
  - **\$1,648 award** tied to **CA Consumer Price Index** to grow over time Removes barriers based on GPA or where/when a student transfers
- Cal Grant 4 for Students at UC, CSU, or Private Institutions

  Tuition coverage at UC, CSU or current award amounts for private institutions

  Removes barriers based on when a student enters/transfers
- Extra Support for Student-Parents and Foster Youth

  Students continue to qualify for \$6,000 grants toward basic needs
- Simplifies State Aid and Aligns with Student Aid Index
  New federal aid system taking effect for the 2024-2025 academic year





#### Cal Grants for Students at

### **Private Nonprofit Institutions**



\$5.5 million ongoing to provide an Increase in the Award Amount from \$9,220 to \$9,358

for the approximately 28,000 Cal Grant students attending a private nonprofit institution



**\$10 million** ongoing to

Extend \$6,000 Cal Grant Access Awards for Foster Youth and Students with Dependent Children attending a private nonprofit institution



**Modifies requirement** that private nonprofit institutions admit students with an Associate Degree for Transfer to maintain award amount, now reflecting annual

**Increases in Transfer Based on Changes to Enrollment** 

### Middle Class Scholarship 2.0



**\$515 million** ongoing, for a **Combined Total of \$632 million** to support modified 2.0 version of MCS



Version 2.0 will focus resources toward

Reducing Students' Total Cost of Attendance



360,000 Students Estimated to be Served by MCS 2.0 in the 2022-23 academic year, up from 57,000



Budget agreement conveys intent to

Add \$227 million on a One-time Basis
in the 2023-24 State Budget to supplement funding MCS 2.0





### Learning-Aligned Employment Program



Established in 2021-22 State Budget to provide funding to public colleges and universities so Underrepresented Students can Access Paid Work-based Learning Opportunities within their subject areas or career interests



2022-23 State Budget includes **\$300 million one-time** for the Learning-Aligned Employment Program for a **total of \$500 million** with funds that established the program in the 2021 Budget Act

## CA Dream Act Service Incentive Grant Program



#### **Provides Awards of up to \$4,500**

increased from current \$3,000, to participating Dream Act students with **300 annual hours of eligible community service** 



Extends program eligibility to include

Cal Grant A Recipients Eligible for Cal Grant B

Proviously, call Creat B recipients equilal portions to

Previously, only Cal Grant B recipients could participate, limiting access for UC students



Allows part-time enrolled students to receive the same awards as their peers for the same amount of service Previously, awards were prorated based on enrollment level



Redirects any unused funds to the public universities for Use in the Dream Loan program





## Golden State Teacher Grant Program



#### **Awards up to \$20,000**

for students in programs seeking to earn a teaching credential or pupil services credential



#### **Expands Eligibility to All Students**

in teacher credential or pupil personnel services programs so long as they **commit to serving at a priority school**, removing a requirement to teach in high-need fields



### **Enables Applications and Initial Eligibility Determinations**


prior to a student's enrollment in a credential program, as well as spreading grant funds over multiple academic years



#### **Extends Timeframe**

during which grant recipients can complete 4 years of service at a priority school to now be over an **8 year period after receiving their grant** 





## "All In" on Financial Aid Applications



#### **Funding and Staff Capacity**

for CSAC to support efforts around universal financial aid applications for high school seniors, taking effect this Fall



**\$2.4 million** ongoing for the California Student Opportunity and Access Program (Cal-SOAP) to Maintain the Existing Projects in the Inland Empire



\$500,000 to create Regional Coordinating Organizations for Cash for College Workshops in Targeted Regions to support implementation efforts involved with universal financial aid applications for high school seniors

### Other Policies & Investments Involving the Commission

- **\$5 million** one-time toward the California Indian Nations College as it pursues accreditation
- Cohort Default Rate data
  published in 2020 for purposes of determining
  institutional eligibility for Cal Grant participation
- Requirement that CA Dept. of Social Services publishes a CalFresh Student Data Dashboard on student applications and access to the program



## Other Key Investments to Address College Costs & Increase Student Support

- Ol Additional \$250 million ongoing for Student Success Completion Grants for community college students enrolled in 12 units or more and receiving a Cal Grant increasing award amounts while reaching more students
- O2 Additional \$200 million one-time for Higher Education Student Housing Grants for public colleges and universities to construct, acquire, or renovate housing for low-income students
- Additional \$170 million ongoing to Support the CalKIDS College Savings Account Program created in 2021, with new resources to support administration & outreach
- \$25 million ongoing to

  Expand the CA College Promise Program
  to returning community college students
- \$20 million one-time for emergency
  Financial Aid for AB 540 Students at Community Colleges



What are the topline numbers for the Commission?





Total amount of funds: \$3.57 billion



Increase of \$199.8 million in total funding year over year and addition of 8 new staff positions



Estimated to serve over 783,000\* students in the 2022-23 academic year
