Annual Philanthropic Report Out for 2023

SUMMARY:

This item provides an annual update on the philanthropic funds received during the 2023 calendar year.

RECOMMENDATION:

This is an information item; no action is required.

BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to Education Code Section 69514.3

- (a) Notwithstanding any other law, the commission may receive donations, bequests, grants, and philanthropic funding, subject to conditions or restrictions that the executive director of the commission may deem advisable, and subject to the approval of the Director of Finance as provided in Section 11005 of the Government Code.
- (b) Beginning January 1, 2024, at the first regular commission meeting of the calendar year, the commission shall publicly report both of the following:
 - (1) The source, and the amount from each source, of any philanthropic funding received during the calendar year immediately preceding the reporting deadline.
 - (2) The purpose for which that philanthropic funding was used.

The Commission and the Foundation for California Community Colleges have developed a memorandum of understanding for the receipt and distribution of philanthropic funds that further the mission and purpose of both parties. Pursuant to Subdivision (a) of Section 69514.3 of the Education Code and Subdivision (a) of Section 11005 of the Government Code, the Department of Finance has approved the use of the following philanthropic donations for 2023.
