## May Revise Update

#### **General Overview**

- Department of Finance projects \$54 Billion budget deficit
- All areas of the budget are impacted
- All higher education segments will see significant budget reductions including cuts to aid for students at private, nonprofit colleges and universities
- May Revise proposes \$1.8B reduction in Higher Education state funding (-10.14%)

#### **Cal Grant Program Modifications (2020-21)**

- Maintains traditional Cal Grant caseload adjustments
  - Plus increased caseload of 10,000 students due to new eligibility from COVID-19 income loss
- Increase of \$599.7M General Fund to adjust for:
  - Decrease of \$600M to reflect decrease in available TANF
  - Decrease of \$348,000 to reflect revised program estimates
- Decrease of \$8.9M to reflect deduction of Cal Grant award for private, non-profit students from \$9,084 to \$8,056
  - Tied to number of Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) admittances statewide
- Access Award for Students with Dependents
  - Caseload adjustments but otherwise maintained
- No changes to Competitive Cal Grant Awards



# Other Proposed Budget Modifications 2020-21

- Middle Class Scholarship (MCS) Program maintained
  - Now capped at \$117M for both UC and CSU students
- Student Loan Debt Service Workgroup & Outreach
  - Decrease of \$4.5M (grant funding)
  - \$500,000 remaining to fund Workgroup activities

#### **Proposed Modifications to 2019-20 Budget**

- Cal Grant Program
  - Increase of **\$11.8M** to account for revised program estimates
- Middle Class Scholarship
  - Increase of <u>\$6.8M</u> to reflect revised program estimates
- Golden State Teacher Grant (GSTG) \$89.7M
  - Reduction of \$88.4M
  - Partially offset with <u>\$15M</u> in federal IDEA funding focusing on recruitment of new special education teachers
  - Remaining \$1.3M for program administration (1.5% carveout)
- Child Savings Account (CSA) Program \$25M
  - Reduction of \$15M
  - \$10M remaining for grants

- Constitutional Deadline to pass Budget: June 15th
- Possible revisions to 2020-21 Budget in August based on revised revenue estimates (tax deadlines in July)
